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SCHOOL EDUCATION DEPARTMENT NOTIFIES ON GURUSHALA TEACHER TRAINING

The Directorate of School Education has notified for the information of all concerned that the 'Pratham Education Foundation' has been implementing a free of cost online teacher training and professional development initiative 'Gurushala' funded by Vodafone Foundation and Indus Towers Ltd. The initiative aims to build capacity and skills of school teachers to effectively use digital technology so as to positively impact the learning levels of students.

For this purpose, the 'Gurushala' team organizes regular online trainings, workshops, subject expert sessions and competitions based on the needs and requirements of states and teachers. Further, they will be preparing a pre-training communication plan with teachers that can align with their immediate requirements on the basis of information provided during the registration process.

Therefore, teachers serving in all Government Schools throughout the State have been directed to get themselves registered at the 'Gurushala Teacher Training' link provided at the Teachers' App or at DoSE Online Education Services Portal (https://dosenl.in). Heads of Institutions of all Government Schools are directed to ensure that a minimum of 75 % of teachers serving in their schools register for the programme without fail.

SCHOOL EDUCATION DEPARTMENT INFORMS GOVERNMENT SCHOOLS

In order to facilitate admissions of children of Immigrant (in-migrant) and Emigrant (out-migrant) Labourers, the Department of School Education is preparing a data base of Immigrant/Emigrant Labourers in regard to the State of Nagaland. Therefore, all concerned are hereby requested to register details of such labourers in any of the nearby Government Schools (GPS/GMS/GHS/GHSS) during the period from 4th to 22nd December 2020.

Further, all government schools in the State have been directed to give admission to any child who has recently returned back to Nagaland without asking for any other documents except, some identity proof. Information provided by the child's parents will be assumed to be correct and taken as such for giving admission to the child in the relevant class in his/her neighbourhood government school.

Public leaders, NGOs and well-wishers are requested to advise all Immigrant/ Emigrant Labourers of their localities to get them registered at nearby government schools and assist the department in ensuring that all eligible children continue studies without any hindrance.

NBSE INFORMS ALL HEADS OF INSTITUTIONS

The Nagaland Board of School Education (NBSE) has informed that the following has been notified to all Heads of Registered Institutions under NBSE for information and compliance:

- 1. Schools should have a plan to keep on tracking the learning outcome of their students and prepare them for the Board Examinations of Class X, XII and Promotion Examination of Class XI.
- 2. Teachers should make all possible efforts to identify the students' progress, deficit area of learning and provide/assist guidance and support.
- 3. The Model Test shall be conducted through online/offline mode. Schools having online facilities are

encouraged to conduct the Model Test online.

- Model Test/Online Test shall be conducted for the students of Classes X, XI and XII from December 2020 to 5th February 2021 by the registered institutions.
- 5. Questions/test items for Model Test should be set for the total full marks as prescribed in the reduced syllabi in all the subjects.
- 6. All the activities carried out for Model Test, Preparatory Test and assessment must be recorded subject-wise by the concerned teacher.
- 7. The Model Test/Preparatory assignments should be conducted within the reduced syllabus. Besides the reduced syllabus, students can also be encouraged to have intensive study of the prescribed course for their career progression.
- 8. Schools shall plan to conduct the Model Test in batches/parts in the form of giving assignments/questions in batches/parts through online or offline mode. Questions that can be answered by the students without taking much time such as MCQs or short answer questions should be used in the Model Test. Similarly, different forms of questions prepared as per the design of the question paper issued by the Board can be considered for the Model Test.
- 9. The Board has come out with the blueprint of the question papers for each subject for the 2021 Board Examinations of High School Leaving Certificate (HSLC) and Higher Secondary School Leaving Certificate (HSSLC) and Class XI Promotion. The blueprint of the question papers shall be made available in the Board's website - www.nbsenagaland.com. The Heads of Institutions must inform the subject teachers to go through the blueprint of different subjects and prepare the questions to assess/evaluate the students. It is to be noted that the question papers of HSLC 2021, HSSLC 2021 and Class XI Promotion Examination 2021 will be based on the blueprint being made available.
- 10. Schools should ensure that teachers are acquainted with the given blueprint of their respective subject and the test items are prepared accordingly for the Model Test.
- 11. Schools must ensure that the teacher prepares the different forms of questions to be sent in batches/parts ahead of time, which are as per the design of the question paper.
- 12. Schools must inform their students to send their answers honestly, whether it be online or offline mode.
- 13. For schools not having connectivity, photocopy of the typed questions can be given to the students and the answers collected back at a specified time in batches. While carrying out the distribution and collection of hard copies of the Model Test, schools must take all generic preventive measures outlined in the Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) in the context of COVID-19 issued by the Government from time to time.
- 14. It is reminded once again that schools must assess and record the activities conducted under internal assessment areas as per the given guidelines for the different subjects, referring the reduced syllabi. (Refer letters on 'Reduced syllabi of Classes X, XI and XII for the academic session 2020, marks distribution, question paper design and internal assessment areas' dated 1st September 2020.
- 15. After the submission of answers by the students through online/offline mode, the answers must be checked by the subject teachers. The marks secured by the students in the Model Test should be entered in the given specified forms along with the internal marks, and emailed to the designated email IDs.

- (b) Form: Progress Report of Classes XI/XII Model Test Emails: For Class XI: nbseclass11@gmail.com For Class XII: nbseclass12@gmail.com
- 16. All schools are to conduct the Model Test and submit their results individually.
- 17. It should be noted that no fixed date routine for the Model Test will be given by the Board. The results of the Model Test along with the internal marks must be emailed to the Board from 6th February 2021 to 12th February 2021.
- 18. All Heads of Institutions are further requested to adopt the following remedial measures to track the learning outcome of the students.
 - (a) Students who could not do well in the tests/assessments should be identified and remedial teaching be given and followed by reassessment. Checking and reviewing the performance and growth of the students' learning is important for resolving the students' deficit areas.
 - (b) Teachers should focus and work on the grey areas where the students are facing learning difficulties.
 - (c) Parents must be updated on their ward's performance, attendance through online or offline mode.
 - (d) Activities which would help release the mental stress of the students in these trying times should also be taken up by the schools.

NBSE NOTIFIES

The Nagaland Board of School Education (NBSE) has notified the following for the information of all the candidates who have filled up the forms for the High School Leaving Certificate (HSLC) and Higher Secondary School Leaving Certificate (HSSLC) Examinations 2021, be it regular, repeaters and eligible Compartmental candidates:

- 1. At the HSLC and HSSLC Examinations 2021, the question papers will be set based on the reduced syllabus which was notified by the Board.
- 2. All candidates regular, repeaters, compartmental will appear the examination using the same question paper prepared from the reduced syllabus (except the subjects mentioned in point No.5).
- 3. The reduced syllabus and the blueprint of the question papers are made available at the Board's website www.nbsenagaland.com
- 4. All candidates are encouraged to visit the website to acquaint themselves with the reduced syllabus.
- 5. However, the question papers of Old Course Science (HSLC) and the Old Course of Business Studies, Accountancy and Entrepreneurship (HSSLC) will be based on the full syllabus. It will not be based on the reduced syllabus.

Further, it may be noted that the HSLC and HSSLC Examinations 2021 shall be conducted through written/offline mode.

STATE GOVERNMENT BANS USE OF POSTERS IN GOVERNMENT OFFICES DURING FUNCTIONS

The Urban Development Department, Nagaland in a notification dated 6th December 2020 has informed that in pursuance to the Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change, Government of India order dated 13th February 2020, using of flex banners/boards/posters by departments/institutions/ government agencies in government offices during functions/programmes, etc. has been totally banned with immediate effect.

Flex banners/boards/posters are made up of Poly-Vinyl-Chlorides (PVC), a plastic polymer which is a non-biodegradable material and if burned, releases harmful toxins and gets bio-accumulated in the food chain of ecosystem causing serious hazards to human health and environment.

The notification further stated that use of eco-friendly materials such as cloth banners, light weight textile fabrics, wrinkle resistant wrap knit, natural-fibre based sandwich boards, resin-infused papers, particle boards, etc. may be encouraged to combat plastic pollution in the State.

The Order informed all AHoDs/HoDs to disseminate this directive to all the District Offices/Institutions/Agencies as well for strict compliance.

NATIONAL EXPERT GROUP ON VACCINE ADMINISTRATION FOR COVID-19 FORMED

With multiple vaccine candidates in various stages of development, Government of India has started preparations for introduction of COVID-19 vaccine and a National Expert Group on Vaccine

Administration for COVID-19 (NEGVAC) has been formed as the highest group that will guide the strategies for vaccine introduction. It is anticipated that the vaccine will be first prioritized for Health Care Workers (HCW) followed by other frontline workers and age groups. In order to establish a coordination mechanism at State and District level for administration of COVID-19 vaccine, the Government of Nagaland has constituted the following Committees:

 - * Regular review of coverage of COVID-19 vaccine and guidance to STF for corrective actions.

 - * Involve other relevant departments including ICDS, PRI and key immunization partners such as UN, UNICEF, WHO, Rotary International, Reproductive, Maternal, Newborn, Child Health and Adolescent Health (RMNCH+A) lead partners and other organizations at State level, CSOs, including professional bodies such as IMA should also be involved.
 - * Review cold chain preparedness across the State for possible introduction of COVID-19 vaccine and guide strengthening measures for the same in view of increased cold chain space requirement.
 - * Identify vaccinators across government and private sectors so as to minimize disruption of routine immunization services while introducing COVID-19 vaccine.
 - * Planning and mapping of vaccination sessions where HCWs will be vaccinated during the 1st phase of COVID-19 vaccine roll-out.
 - * Mapping human resources across departments that could be deployed for vaccination sessions for verification of beneficiaries, crowd management and overall coordination at session site.
 - * Communicate with District Magistrates (DM) for conducting meetings of District Task Force.

- * Ensure identification and accountability of senior officers in the blocks and the urban cities. They should visit these blocks and provide oversight to activities for rollout of COVID-19 vaccine, including participation in training, monitoring etc.
- * Robust communication planning at all levels to address rumour mongering as well as vaccine eagerness. Ensure adequate number of printed IEC materials (as per prototypes) are printed and disseminated to blocks/planning units in time. Ensure that these materials are discussed and used in the sensitization workshops.
- * Track blocks and urban areas for adherence to timelines for various activities required for introduction of COVID-19 vaccine.
- * Ensure timely disbursal of funds at all levels.
- * Share key qualitative and quantitative feedback at State level for review.

INTRODUCTION OF NEW MAJOR FEATURES AND FUNCTIONALITIES IN GeM PORTAL

The Finance Department has informed that the Ministry of Commerce, Government e-Marketplace has introduced new major features and functionalities in GeM portal. It also conveyed that existing services has been revamped creating new user friendly services which are live on the platform.

Therefore the Department has requested all government departments, PSUs, commercial organisations, start-ups, Self Help Groups, artisans and craftpersons to make use of the full potential of GeM.

NAGALAND CELEBRATES 58th STATEHOOD DAY

KOHIMA:

Nagaland celebrated the 58^{th} Statehood Day at Nagaland Civil Secretariat Plaza, Kohima on 1^{st} December 2020. On the occasion, the Chief Minister of Nagaland, Neiphiu Rio, extended his warmest greetings to the people of the State and called to remember with gratitude the leaders, who by their sacrifices, foresightedness and determination ensured the creation of Nagaland with a special constitutional provision as the 16^{th} State of the Union of India.

Rio said that the State Government convened a consultative meeting on 15th October 2020 with all the representatives of all the Tribal Hohos, civil society organizations, political parties, ex-parliamentarians and various public leaders on the Naga Political Issue. A seven-point resolution was adopted unanimously and it acknowledged the sacrifices and contributions of the nationalist workers in the course of the Naga political journey and urged the Naga political groups to honour and respect the Covenant of Reconciliation and maintain the sanctity of non-violence in letter and spirit for a 'Shared Naga Future' as members of 'One Naga Family.'

On preparations for combating the pandemic, Rio said that the State Government took every possible step to further develop and improve our entire health infrastructure. He said that the State Government managed to go from a State with nil testing capacity to 2,600-3,000 testing capacity per day. The number of ventilators in the State has been increased from 14 to 145 and 110 departmental ambulances. There also has been an increase in the strength of the healthcare workers through recruitment of 109 medical doctors, 5 dental surgeons, 129 nurses, 6 research scientists, 6 laboratory technicians for BSL Laboratories, 10 OT technicians and 13 ECG technicians, and the appointment of 21 AYUSH doctors and 129 nurses is nearing completion. Further, a new Cath Lab has been installed in CIHSR, Dimapur and a new medical college is also being established in Mon, he added.

Rio said that the Department of Employment, Skill Development & Entrepreneurship initiated the introduction of Mobile Skill Morung, to ensure access to skill development for rural youth and women. It is a self-contained 'Training Workshop on Wheels' equipped with machineries and equipment that can travel with trainers across the State which was flagged off on 13th November 2020. The Nagaland Joblinks Portal has also been launched in which job seekers and employers can register themselves and job seekers can get connected with employers in private sector establishments. The Department has also rolled out the Multi-Skilled Handyman programme to ensure that every trainee is skilled in three or four job roles to earn their livelihood. This program was also launched on the 13th of November 2020.

Rio added that, 'LaunchPad' - a career guidance and skill development programme, an initiative of the Department of Youth Resources & Sports in partnership with YouthNet was launched on 18th August 2020. It is an online training programme for 12th standard students of all government secondary school across Nagaland. The Task Force for Music and Arts (TaFMA) has started Music Incubation Programme, where young artists are being trained to fit into the ever growing music industry.

On Agriculture sector, Rio said that the Department has distributed selected kharif and rabi seeds on the basis of local needs well ahead of time to ensure that the farmers do not suffer due to COVID-19 restrictions. Also, the Department has initiated an action plan to take up the Naga model of Integrated Settled Farming on pilot basis during the current year. This model is being initiated to attain self-sufficiency and sustain the traditional system of jhum cultivation. To give a further boost to the economy and to create employment opportunities, special programmes under NEC funding are being Vol. 49 No. 10 **Jan. 2021**

launched for agriculture and allied sectors. The Department of Horticulture has initiated two units of nurseries, one for orange in Kohima and another for kiwi and persimmon in Pfutsero. The recent observation made by the Union Agriculture Minister, that Nagaland should be made 'Kiwi State of India' is proof to the fact that the State has been recognised as a kiwi producing hub, he added.

Despite the COVID-19 pandemic, Rio said that the Tourism Department has outlined several strategies for the revival of the tourism industry in Nagaland in a safe and sustainable manner thereby promoting it as a 'Safe Destination.' Furthermore, the Department with the Government of Nagaland is celebrating the 21st edition of the Annual Hornbill Festival 2020 completely in a virtual mode only, a first of its kind for the State.

Rio informed that the Department of School Education launched the innovative Online Digital Education in the State which has been working since May 2020 and it also has developed an Online Students Evaluation Portal which could be easily accessed through any Mobile/Laptop/PC and would work efficiently even with 2G internet connections. In order to ensure that the process of continuous learning is sustained in all government schools throughout the State, particularly in remote and rural areas, 'Continuous Learning & Monitoring Cell' has been constituted to monitor learning activities through the newly developed Online School Monitoring System. Further, in order to keep the teachers updated with the latest developments in the field of education and also to monitor the progress of their activities, the Department launched the Teacher's App in the month of September 2020, he added.

The CM said that the Higher Education sector received an impetus with the laying of the foundation stone of the Professional College of Music & Fine Arts at Tsiesema, Kohima district, the inauguration of the Science Laboratory building of Phek Government College and Science Stream building at Dimapur Government College. The academic session of the newly established Government Polytechnic Aboi, Mon, along with Government Polytechnic Wokha and Peren are expected to start from 2021-2022 since creation of posts has been cleared by the Government.

Rio informed that the Public Works Department has successfully completed the improvement of Kohima and Dimapur city roads. Under MoRTH, DONER and NEC for various categories, 48 projects covering more than 597 kilometres of road are being taken up this financial year. Under PMGSY, work is ongoing on another 300 kilometres of road.

The PHED during the 100 days campaign launched on 2rd October 2020, aiming to provide water supply to all the schools and Anganwadis, provided piped water supply to 380 schools and 110 Anganwadis. In MGNREGA, the approved target for the current financial year for the State is 200 lakh person days, out of which 135.38 lakh person days have been generated till date.

Rio informed that the Directorate of Fire & Emergency Services has completed the construction of the Central Workshop at New Capital Complex, Kohima and the CAWD has completed the construction of residences of four Deputy Commissioners which will all be inaugurated shortly. Also, the Directorate of Home Guards, Civil Defence and State Disaster Response Force has completed the construction of the 100 bedded trainees barracks multi-storeyed building at Central Training Institute, Toluvi, Dimapur. He added that the Municipal Affairs Department under KSCDL (Kohima Smart City Development Ltd), has resumed three uncompleted projects under the mission, namely 'Multi-level Vehicle Parking at Old Medical Directorate,' 'Multi-level Vehicle Parking at Old NST,' and the 'Capital Cultural Hall' above NSF Martyrs Park.

The CM conveyed special wishes to the people of Noklak district, the youngest district of the State, on the occasion of the Statehood day. He said that the State has been able to build good capabilities in every sector, and the unified response in combating COVID-19 is a testimony of it. He also said that there are many developmental areas and

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sectors, where a lot remains to be done and needs persistent efforts to ensure that Nagaland is at par with the rest of the states in the country.

The Committee discussed and deliberated all the six charter of demands submitted by ENSF in respect of NSSB and decided that the Committee will expedite its report and submit its recommendations to the Cabinet latest by 31st December 2020. The Committee has sincerely appealed to the ENSF to withdraw their agitation and allow the Government to decide the issues based on findings in the larger public interest.

NATIONAL WEBINAR ON COVID-19 AND CLIMATE CHANGE

National Webinar on COVID-19 and Climate Change: Challenges and Responses was held on 3rd December 2020 by Nagaland State Climate Change Cell, NASTEC. NASTEC, an autonomous body of the Department of Science & Technology, conducted the webinar which comprised a panel of experts and resource persons, State Nodal Officer, IDSP, Climate Change & Human Health, Health & Family Welfare Department, Nagaland, Dr. Nyan Kikon, Senior Fellow Climate Change, M. S. Swaminathan Research Foundation, Chennai, Professor, T. Jayaraman and CCF & State Nodal Officer for Climate Change, Department of Environment, Forests & Climate Change, Supongnukshi, IFS.

During the discussion, Dr. Nyan Kikon mentioned that the current pandemic crisis, like any other crisis, offers an opportunity for the people to regain a sense of shared humanity where everyone realises that things that matters most to us, like health and safety of our loved ones and the extension of health and safety of our loved ones in the community will reflect how we can give back to the coming generations. He also said that the global pandemic illustrates how inequality is a major barrier in ensuring health and wellbeing of the people and how social and economic inequalities materialises in unequal access to healthcare system.

Professor, T. Jayaraman, from the perspectives of environmental/climate point of view stated that the COVID-19 is not essential to the wellbeing of humans, whereas in regard to Green House Gas (GHG) emissions, until there is an alternative, there is no way that the contemporary world can function. He also said that the COVID-19 is an intruder into the lives of human society which needs to be eradicated, but to completely eradicate

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GHG emissions would be impossible.

Supongukshi stated that there has been a huge difference in the environment. Without the intervention of humans, nature has its own way to regenerate. However the improvement in the environment which resulted from COVID-19 response may be reversed by rapid expansion of polluting economic activities, unless there is a focus to promote environmental health, climate change will gradually increase and it will pose as a threat to everything and everyone. In their concluding remarks, the resource persons mentioned that there is no evidence of a direct connection between climate change and transmission of COVID-19. However, climate change may indirectly affect the COVID-19 response as it undermines environmental determinants of health, and places additional stress on health systems. Strengthening health systems and greater protection of biodiversity and natural environment may help reducing the risks of future outbreaks of diseases.

REPORT ON INTER-STATE MOVEMENT OF STRANDED PERSONS RELEASED

Principal Secretary, Home, Abhijit Sinha, IAS released the Report on the Inter-State Movement of Stranded Persons on 4th December 2020 at the Secretariat Conference Hall, Kohima.

Abhijit Sinha congratulated the Working Group headed by Commissioner & Secretary Personnel & Administrative Reforms, Dinesh Kumar, IAS who was also the Chief Nodal Officer for Inter-State Movement of Stranded Persons, for successfully conducting the exercise assigned to them. He stated that a lot of effort was put in to bring back the stranded persons from outside the State and appreciated the team for documentation of the process. He observed that the State Government had managed to bring back most of the stranded persons who wanted to return back to Nagaland and added that that was a sense of satisfaction within the officers and staff for the efforts put out to help the people.

Commissioner & Secretary and Chief Nodal Officer for Inter-State Movement of Stranded Persons, Dinesh Kumar, IAS while giving a brief introduction on the Report, said that tremendous amount of effort has gone into the facilitation of the inter-state movement of persons of Nagaland stranded in other states and persons of other states stranded in Nagaland wishing to return back to their home states. The documentation is an attempt to place on paper the journey of the Working Group set up by the Government of Nagaland to alleviate the issues faced by the stranded persons and facilitate their movement back to their homes safely, he added.

Dinesh Kumar said that the four additional zones were created to aid in the inter-state movement. He stated that 34 special buses, 12 Shramik special trains covering 1,02,555 Km in 28 days managed to bring back 13,594 returnees to Nagaland. He added that around 14,600 calls were made to stranded persons by the zonal teams in order to facilitate inter-state movements. He also informed that Nagaland has created history by arranging the Shramik special trains covering the longest train route covering 4,322 Km in India during that period.

The Working Group, led by Dinesh Kumar, IAS and his team also presented a copy of the Report on the Inter-State Movement of Stranded Persons to the Chief Secretary, Nagaland, Jan E Alam, IAS in his office chamber.

PANEL DISCUSSION ON NEP, 2020 HELD AT KOHIMA

Panel discussion on National Education Policy (NEP), 2020 organised by Nagaland Education Association (NEA) in collaboration with the Directorate of School Education, Nagaland was held at the Directorate of School Education, Nagaland, Kohima on 5th December 2020.

In the keynote address, Dr. Bweyhunle Khing, Vice President, NEA mentioned that the panel discussion on NEP 2020 is the right platform as it includes all the renowned, and professional educationists who are the torchbearers. She mentioned that NEP 2020 drafted and approved by the Central Government, was amended to bring changes for the entire structure of Indian education system and to reform the structure of educational policy. Dr. Khing also highlighted some of the important objectives of NEP 2020, the main vision being to enable all the learners by providing high quality education and to explore and make our nation a global leadership in the field of economic growth, scientific advancement, cultural preservation, social justice, equality and learners to avail by giving opportunity to choose their own courses for students from school to university level, and at the same time, by giving due exposure to vocational education and also to recognise and identify the unique capabilities of each student and encourage them to have holistic approach in both academic and non-academic sector.

The panelist included Principal Director, School Education, Shanavas C, IAS, former

Director, State Council of Educational Research & Training (SCERT), Vipralhou Kesiezie, Professor, Department of Education, Nagaland University, Professor Buno Liegise, Advisor, All Nagaland Private School Association, Pheluopfelie Kesiezie, Professor and Head of the Department of Education, Nagaland University, Professor Rakesh Rai, Chairman, Nagaland Board of School Education, Asano Sekhose.

Principal Director, School Education, Shanavas C, IAS said that the National Education Policy 2020 (NEP) is a comprehensive framework for elementary education to higher education as well as vocational training in both rural and urban India. The policy envisages a new curricular and pedagogical structure for school education which is responsive and relevant to the needs and interests of learners at different stages of their development. This policy aims to shape an education system that benefits all. He said that one of the main focus has to be more on content and results which will now pave way that aims to encourage cognition and creativity.

On the question raised by one of the participants on the eligibility test for recruitment, Shanavas said that basing on the new policy, Large Teacher Eligibility Tests will be strengthened, to include to reflect a score that will be taken into consideration during recruitment. A minimum of 50 hours of participation in such CPD is required in a year. Assessment and other methods will be put in to measure the student learning and understanding. Shanavas acknowledged that the panel discussion is to sort out how to implement the policy and to have more ideas whether it will suit our State

Former Director, SCERT, Vipralhou stated that the new education system is meant to build a future citizen to fit into the social, cultural, and economic processes of the nation. The main focus in the policy is on tracking performance based on learning outcomes. The tests will be on core concepts and knowledge, higher-order skills. NEP-2020 has envisioned making the examinations easier to test core capabilities and competencies. The policy will transform the assessment system by reorienting teachers. The boards of the future have to be different than the way they are functioning today, focus should move from formative, rote learning to a system of skills and competencies, the policy envisages assessment to undergo a transformation by emphasising continuous tracking of learning. He added that the National Testing Agency (NTA) will offer high quality common aptitude tests, and the self and peer assessment methods are a healthy sign which will help to reflect the progress and uniqueness of the learner's cognitive capabilities.

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Professor Rakesh Rai added that holistic and multidisciplinary education will help students to learn and allows students with a flexibility to combine multi-disciplinary subjects along with integration of vocational courses. The new element is that students will be given 'multiple exit options' and appropriate 'certification' will be given to them within their graduation tenure. He mentioned that the Government is also taking steps towards establishment of Multi-disciplinary Education and Research Universities and a National Research Foundation is in the pipeline to be created for fostering research and other development activities

NAGALAND CELEBRATES WORLD SOIL DAY

Department of Soil & Water Conservation, Nagaland in coordination with the Food and Agriculture Organisation, United Nations organised an event to celebrate World Soil Day with the theme, "Keep soil alive, protect soil biodiversity" on 5th December 2020 at Hotel Japfu, Kohima.

Sangtam in his speech said the theme has urged all to focus our attention on workers below the ground, from the tiny bacteria to the slimy earthworm which contributes to processes that are indispensable to life on earth since biodiversity loss has affected the soil. He said the Department of Soil & Water Conservation has been a forerunner in conservation of natural resources since its inception and said that

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in order to sustain and manage the environment and to enhance agricultural productivity, proper assessment of natural resources for its capacity is of paramount importance. Therefore, he said to achieve these goals, the government has implemented Soil Health Management Scheme across the State on a mission under National Mission for Sustainable Agriculture under the Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare which aims at promoting crop specific nutrient management and its judicious use. The Minister also called upon the Department and all the Agri and Allied departments and officials to make use of the Health Management through the Soil Testing Laboratory which have been set up in all the districts.

Agricultural Production Commissioner (APC), Nagaland, Y. Kikheto Sema, IAS speaking on the occasion stated that it is now time for us as humans to stop being selfish and start taking care of the soil. He stressed on the importance of all the Agri and Allied departments to come together as one and work for the betterment of the State. The APC also spoke about the upcoming project Naga Model Integrated Settle Farming under which all Agri-Allied departments would work in a single cluster of 50 hectare land which would eventually benefit the farmers of the State.

Addressing the gathering, Director, Soil & Water Conservation, K. Zhekheto Awomi emphasized on the importance of having the knowledge of the various macro and micro essential elements and nutrients present in the soil to evaluate the most suitable type of crop to be planted. He also stressed on the important role the bureaucracy, legislative and executive plays in imparting such valuable knowledge and awareness to the farmers' community in the State. Awomi concluded by appreciating the Central Ministry and State Government for establishing Soil Testing Labs in all the districts of the State and welcomed all Agri-Allied officers to work together and use the facility.

Theme Speaker of the event, Principal Scientist (Soil Science) & Head Division of NRM, ICAR-RC NEH, Umiam, Meghalaya, Dr. Samarendra Hazarika took part at the event through online video conference. He stated that the objective of the event is to create awareness for the protection and preservation of the health of the soil. He enlightened the gathering with various technicalities of the types of soil components with special focus on the North East especially Nagaland. He stressed on the challenges of over exploitation of soil over the years and concluded by stating, "Use but do not abuse."

Additional Director & State Nodal Officer, Soil Health Management, K. Khekiho Shohe while highlighting the Soil Health Management Scheme and Challenges in the State and North East India, said the Government of India has provided many schemes and facilities for Soil Health Management and organic farming practices for the State and he encouraged farmers across the State to avail these facilities which are free of cost. He also mentioned that the State Government has handed over the responsibility for Soil Health Management to the Department of Soil & Water Conservation, Nagaland in 2019 and since then, the department has taken up the initiative of setting up Bio Organic Quality Control Lab, Soil Testing Laboratory and Fertilizer Quality Control Lab in all the districts of the State. He also said that three mobile vans are also in service for testing of soil for places in remote areas and informed that the Referral Soil Testing Laboratory at the Directorate of Soil & Water Conservation, Kohima would be upgraded with Inductively Complied Plasma Mass Spectrometry (ICP) which can also be used for food testing, food poisoning, etc. and could be of help for Health & Family Welfare Department, Public Health Engineering Department, Police Department, etc.

The gathering also witnessed a short video clip on the theme, "Keep soil alive, protect biodiversity" and the release of a brochure on Soil Health Management Scheme which would be translated in all local languages of the State.

The event was chaired by Commissioner & Secretary, Soil & Water Conservation, Vikeyie Kenya, IAS and the vote of thanks was delivered by Deputy Director (SS&LUP), Soil & Water Conservation, Rongsenlemzung. BRIEFING ON COVID-19 ON 5th OF DECEMBER 2020 FOR NAGALAND BY PRINCIPAL SECRETARY, HOME

The Principal Secretary, Home informed that as on 5^{th} December 2020, the total number of COVID-19 detected cases stands at 11,340.

Out of the 11,340 positive cases, the total recoveries so far are 10,649. The active cases are 511 and there have been 58 deaths. As per the severity of symptoms, 447 active cases are asymptomatic, 41 active cases are mild, 15 active cases are moderate on oxygen, 1 active case is severe on oxygen, 6 active cases are critical without oxygen and 1 active case is on ventilator.

Further, out of 11,340 positive cases, the distribution across various categories of people are: 4,574 cases of Armed Forces/Police, 1,784 cases of Returnees, 4,435 cases of Traced Contacts and 547 cases of Frontline Workers.

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A total of 69,946 samples have been sent for testing through RT-PCR and results of 69,887 samples have been received. In addition, a total 36,155 samples have been sent for testing on TrueNat and results of 36,149 samples have been received. Through Rapid Antigen Test 8,381 samples have been tested.

STATE LEVEL WORKSHOP ON ETHNOGRAPHY AND VISUAL DOCUMENTATION HELD AT KSC, JOTSOMA

A three day state level workshop on Ethnography and Visual Documentation under the theme 'Techniques of Visual Imagery' was organized by the Department of Anthropology, Kohima Science College (Autonomous), Jotsoma from the 3rd to 5th December 2020. The workshop was sponsored by the Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development (RGNIYD), Sriperumbudur, Tamil Nadu.

The resource persons for the workshop were Kivini Shohe (filmmaker), Sophy Lasuh Kesiezie (filmmaker), Kekhriezhazo Miachieo (freelance photographer and part time filmmaker) and Thejanguzo Titus Pienyü (freelance filmmaker and storyteller) - all accomplished personalities in different areas of visual imagery and well recognized for their works.

The workshop was conducted putting much emphasis on the technical aspects of visual documentation and the resource persons delved into great details regarding a number of important subjects, namely aspects of documentaries, visual ethnography, photography and cinematography. The entire workshop was monitored live from RGNIYD, Sriperumbudur, Tamil Nadu.

On the third and final day of the workshop, respective group projects were screened and displayed in the last technical session. The workshop concluded with a valedictory session chaired by Kevilhuninuo Nagi, Associate Professor, Department of Anthropology. The valedictory address was delivered by Dr. Vasanthi Rajendran, Professor Training, RGNIYD, live from Tamil Nadu. The valedictory session officially ended with the vote of thanks by Dr. David Tetso, Assistant Professor, Department of Anthropology.

The three day State level workshop on ethnography and visual documentation may have been a new concept to many in the State but one cannot deny its importance and relevance in today's modern world with so much technological advancement. The value of images in research processes is rooted in its permeated role in our imaginations, technologies, texts, and conversations and more directly in how they inform individual personalities, narratives, lifestyles, cultures, and societies. Visual ethnography is a research methodology and describes photography, drawing, film, and web-based media as methods of data gathering.

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HOME GUARDS, CIVIL DEFENCE & SDRF OBSERVES 58th RAISING DAY

The Nagaland Home Guards Act of 1988 was passed by the State Legislature on 12th May 1988. Both Civil Defence and Home Guards Organization complement each other and co-exist under a common Head of Office. While Civil Defence deals with incidences arising out of

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external aggression to the country in general, the Home Guards deal with incidences arising out of internal security, natural calamities like landslides, earthquake, fire, strikes, communal disharmony, socio-economic and welfare activities.

Mokokchung also observed the annual Raising Day at the District Office premises on 6th December 2020. A brief programme was observed under the chairmanship of Imlimatsung, Company Commander. Messages on the occasion by the President of India, Prime Minister, Union Home Minister, Governor, Chief Minister, Advisor (Department of Social Welfare and Department of Home Guards, Civil Defence & SDRF), Union Home Secretary and Director General, Fire Service, Civil Defence & Home Guards, New Delhi were read out. CENTRAL TEAM VISITS KOHIMA TO REVIEW PUBLIC HEALTH MEASURES AND CLINICAL MANAGEMENT FOR COVID-19

A central team from the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (PH Division) visited Naga Hospital Authority Kohima (NHAK) on 14th December 2020 to assist State Health Department in review of public health measures and clinical management for COVID-19.

The team included Sanjay Kumar, AS & FA, Ministry of Road Transport & Highway (Nodal Officer); Dr. S. R. Karmakar, Senior Public Health, Kolkata and Dr. Mohd. Jamil, Associate Professor, Medicine, North Eastern Indira Gandhi Regional Institute of Health & Medical Sciences (NEIGRIHMS).

The team reviewed overall COVID-19 related activities in regard to containment, surveillance, testing, infection prevention and

control measures, clinical management protocol for COVID-19 in the district.

On their visit at NHAK, the Managing Director, Dr. Thorhusie Katiry gave a powerpoint presentation on status of COVID-19 activities at NHAK from 23rd March 2020 till 14th December 2020. He informed that the NHAK has collected a total sample of 24,806, which included 17,308 from BSL-3 and 7,498 from TrueNat as on 13th December 2020. Out of 24,806 sample collected, a total of 2,759 were detected as positive cases while 21,925 were negative cases and 122 are awaited. Positive cases admitted in NHAK was 339 where 263 were discharged, 21 deaths and 43 were shifted to Meriema COVID Care Centre (MCCC), other hospitals and home isolation.

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Dr. Thorhusie also informed on the NHAK COVID-19 Ward arrangements, where he stated that NHAK has three wards, which included Transition Ward, COVID-19 Isolation Ward and COVID-19 ICU. He further highlighted on the status report of COVID-19 NHAK in regard to availability of beds, status of confirmed cases in COVID-19 Hospital and clinical status of current cases.

Dr. Aseno, DSO, Kohima also presented on the overall COVID-19 testing status of Kohima district, which included BSL-3 Lab, RT-PCR, NHAK TrueNat, private hospitals, CMO Office and BSF where she informed that a total of 34,607 were tested, out of which 3,615 were tested positive and 29,998 were negative as on 11th December 2020. Out of 3,615 positive cases in the district, Dr. Aseno informed that 778 were detected from Army/Security Forces, 489 returnees, 172 frontline workers, 130 home makers, 398 students, 22 taxi drivers, 166 unemployed, 272 children, 7 pregnant mothers and 1,181 working population/persons. She also highlighted on various COVID-19 related activities carried out at quarantine centres, check-gates and CMO Mobile Team in the district.

FIRST STF MEETING ON COVID-19 VACCINE

The first State Task Force (STF) meeting on COVID-19 vaccine was held on 15th December 2020 under the chairmanship of the Principal Secretary, Health & Family Welfare (H&FW). Senior officers from Directorate of H&FW, Department of Information &Public Relations (DIPR), WCD and Social Welfare Department attended the meeting along with state level development partners from WHO, UNICEF and UNDP.

The STF deliberated on the rollout of COVID-19 for the first phase and the role of all stakeholders in the statewide campaign. There will be regular monitoring of the database in the CoWIN dashboard so that no health units and beneficiaries are left out in the first phase. State will ensure healthcare worker data is validated. DC and CMOs will ensure 100 percent registration. A line list of all cold chain points with current storage capacity, storage used by RI vaccines and storage for COVID-19 vaccine/shortage of space will be highlighted as per population or beneficiaries. The next STF meeting will have a presentation on district wise status of cold chain points.

Monitoring and supervision of cold chain points in addition to the CoWIN dashboard will be done by State and District level officers. Joint Directors incharge of districts will be deputed for the same. The supervisors, cold chain technicians and other managers will ensure NCCMIS portal, S4i app is used during supportive supervision and NCCMIS portal is updated monthly.

Specific roles of all departments/stakeholders were also discussed wherein it was decided that IEC Wing from the H&FW will coordinate with DIPR for appropriate awareness and IEC activities. Social Welfare Department will be part of the vaccination team. CDPOs, other supervisors, and Anganwadis will be designated specific roles for the same. AWW will specially be needed in urban areas where there are no ASHAs. School teachers from School Education Department will be designated roles in the vaccination or supervision teams. NRLM, Rural Development Department will actively support in mobilisation and arrangement of necessary logistics as and when needed and will be part of vaccination teams. Municipal bodies, NGOs, FBOs will be actively involved for mobilisation and awareness activities as and when required.

The following broad guidelines will be followed for the first phase vaccination of healthcare workers:

- a. Session sites will be clubbed as per line list of beneficiaries. PHCs with low beneficiaries can be clubbed accordingly to minimise wastage, taking into account cost and feasibility of transport.
- b. The first phase will be planned in health units with cold chain points (fixed session sites). In urban areas with high case load, sites without cold chain can also be included to avoid crowding.

H&FW HOLDS CONSULTATIVE MEETING ON COVID-19

On account of the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic and with a view to contain the risk of spread of COVID-19 during the winter season which coincides with flu season coupled with the ensuing festive season, the Department of Health & Family Welfare (H&FW) held a consultative meeting with church organizations, civil society organisations, representatives of District Administration and Municipal Council was held on 16th December 2020. During the meeting the following were resolved:

- To reiterate the necessity of observance of preventive measures especially with regard to 'COVID-19 appropriate behaviours' issued through SOP for all residents of the State.
- To involve actively in creating awareness in sensitizing people on prevention of COVID-19.
- 3. Strict enforcement of SOP, and to take action for violation of the SOP as per legal provisions against the offenders.
- 4. Appeal to all concerned:
 - (a) To avoid mobile carolling in groups and processions, picnics, partying, merrymaking and other entertainment events that involve crowding.
 - (b) To defer or postpone conferences, jubilees, convocations, etc. scheduled during the festive season.
 - (c) Weddings to follow SOP and preventive measures at all times.
 - (d) Christmas and New Year Community feasts may be avoided or if unavoidable, may be served in takeaway packages and to follow all social distancing measures and COVID-19 appropriate behaviour at all times.

- (e) To avoid travelling to other places particularly from towns to villages to attend social events. If unavoidable, to follow preventive measures at all times.
- (f) Devotional services should be staggered to minimize crowding and to follow preventive measures at all times.
- (g) Food vendors should observe SOP and not entertain customers without wearing face mask and ensure that there is no crowding around the stalls, and to serve the food in take-away packages.
- (h) People with flu-like symptoms should isolate themselves and come forward for testing as timely testing, detection and early treatment can prevent debilitating complications and reduce mortalities.
- (i) Public transport operators to adhere with the SOP and authorized enforcing agencies to take strict action for violation of the SOP as per legal provisions against the offenders.
- 5. Let it be known to all young people that COVID-19 complications does not discriminate but affects all age groups. Maximum confirmed cases are between the age of 20-40 years and even if they don't develop complications, may spread the disease and become super-spreaders endangering the community particularly the elderly and people with co-morbidities. Further, symptomatic cases are also increasing. It is therefore of utmost importance that the SOP are followed by everyone.

STATE WELL PREPARED FOR COVID -19 VACCINATION DRIVE

Mission Director, Health & Family Welfare (H&FW), Dr. Kevichusa Medikhru called on a press conference to highlight the status of COVID-19 vaccine preparedness in the State at the Directorate of H&FW, Conference Hall on 17^{th} December 2020.

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Addressing the media, Dr. Medikhru highlighting about the COVID-19 vaccination drive in the State, said the State is well prepared and waiting for the rollout of the vaccine from the Centre. He said that the first wave of COVID-19 vaccination will cover 30 crore Indians including Nagaland. He stated that the vaccination will be in phase wise and the 1st phase will be for the healthcare workers, 2nd phase will be for frontline workers followed by above 50 and the last phase will be below age 50 with co-morbidities.

Dr. Medikhru informed that the data

collection for the health workers in health facility in the State is completed and that 19.654 beneficiaries have been listed in the portal. He remarked that the vaccine will not be provided in sub-centres but will be available in district hospitals, CHC and PHC. He also stated that the State is well prepared for COVID-19 immunization process and the Adverse Event Following Immunization (AEFI) and further added that the vaccination will be free of cost. He said that though the vaccination will not be compulsory for the beneficiaries, the Government insists that every beneficiary will be vaccinated. The other exercises to follow are the data collection for frontline workers and above 50 plus beneficiaries list which he said is a huge task ahead for the Department.

DECLARATION OF NSCN (KHAPLANG) AS UNLAWFUL ASSOCIATION

With reference to the Ministry of Home Affairs Notification No. 3350(E) dated 28.09.2020 declaring National Socialist Council of Nagaland (Khaplang) as Unlawful Association under Sub-Section (1) of Section 3 of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, 1967, the Home Department, Nagaland has issued the following notification from the Ministry, the full text of which is as follows:

"Whereas, the National Socialist Council of Nagaland (Khaplang) [here in referred to as NSCN (K)], has its professed aim to create a sovereign Nagaland incorporating the Naga inhabited areas of Indo-Myanmar region by secession from the Indian Union in alliance with other armed secessionist
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organisations of Nagaland and North Eastern region;

And whereas, the Central Government is of the opinion that the NSCN (K), is continuously:

- Aiming to create a sovereign Nagaland incorporating the Naga inhabited areas of Indo-Myanmar region by secession from the Indian Union;
- Engaging in unlawful and violent activities thereby undermining the authority of the Government of India and the Governments of Nagaland, Manipur and Arunachal Pradesh and spreading terror and panic among the people;
- Aligning itself with other unlawful association like the United Liberation Front of Asom (ULFA), Meitei organisations of Manipur;
- Indulging in kidnapping for ransom and extortion of money from businessmen, government officials and other civilians;
- v. Embarking on a drive for recruitment of cadres to continue its terrorist activities;
- vi. Establishing camps and hideouts across the international borders;
- vii. Obtaining assistance from anti-India forces in other countries to procure arms and other assistance.
- viii. Indulging in unlawful and violent activities intended to disrupt, the sovereignty and territorial integrity of India in furtherance of its objective of achieving a separate State.

And whereas the Central Government is of the opinion that since 28.9.2015, NSCN (K) has

been involved in 104 violence incidents resulting in killings of 7 security forces personnel and 6 civilians and abduction of 75 civilians.

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And whereas the Central Government is of the opinion that the aforesaid activities of the NSCN (K) are detrimental to the sovereignty and integrity of India and that it is an unlawful association;

And whereas, the Central Government is also of the opinion that if there is no immediate curb and control of unlawful activities of the NSCN (K), the organisation may make fresh recruitment, indulge in violent, terrorist and secessionist activities, collect funds and endanger the lives of innocent citizens and security forces personnel; and therefore, circumstances do exist which render it necessary to declare the NSCN (K) as an unlawful association with immediate effect;

Now therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by Sub-Section (1) of Section 3 of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, 1967 (37 of 1967) (hereinafter referred to as the said Act) the Central Government hereby declares the National Socialist Council of Nagaland (Khaplang), NSCN (K) along with all its factions, wings and front organisations as an unlawful association.

Whereas, the Central Government having regard to the above circumstances, is of the firm opinion that it is necessary to declare the NSCN (K) along with all its factions, wings and front organisation as an unlawful association with immediate effect; and accordingly, in exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to Sub-Section (3) of Section 3 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby directs that this notification shall, subject to any order that may be made under section 4 of the said Act, have effect from that date of its publication in the Official Gazette."

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FOUR SCHOOLS AND TWO VILLAGES DECLARED FREE TOBACCO AREA AT WOKHA

Wokha District Tobacco Control Cell, District Level coordination Committee and District Level Enforcement Squad, NTCP, Wokha held its quarterly meeting on 15th December 2020 at the official Chamber of the Deputy Commissioner (DC), Wokha. EAC, I. Yentinougbou chaired the meeting.

During the meeting, four schools namely, Fernbrook, Libemo Memorial, Government School Sector A, Little Angel School and Longsachung village and Niroyo village were declared free tobacco schools and villages respectively. With this declaration, the district now has 23 free tobacco schools and four free tobacco villages. The certificates were handed over by Chief Medical Officer, Wokha, Dr. C. W. Tungoe who urged them to maintain the criteria and standards for effective implementation of the law.

Dr. Daisy Ovung, DNO, NTCP, Wokha while presenting the quarterly reports of DTCC, said the team had visited shops selling tobacco products from Niropen colony to NST colony covering around 100 shops on COTPA Section 6, where shops owners were directed to display board with specified warning indicating that 'Selling of any tobacco products to and by any person below 18 years of age is a punishable offence.' She also informed that enforcement drive was also conducted on 24th November 2020 comprising of COTPA Flying Squad, members from NTCP and Dobashis, and the team visited 40 hotels and restaurants within the town to ensure prohibition of smoking in public places.

The team directed the owners/in-charge to display 'No Smoking' signage and its specification in form of IEC were also distributed. The team during the raid penalized four defaulters for violation of COTPA Section 4. Training and awareness for Sunday School teachers, PRI on tobacco control at schools, villages, hospital staff, youth, churches and tobacco users were also conducted during the period from October to December 2020, and besides that, total number of 33 tobacco users were counselled and 14 were given free pharmacological support.

The members also deliberated to strengthen the enforcement of COTPA law and to conduct enforcement activities once every month, where District Nodal Officer (NTCP), Dr. Daisy appealed to all the members to extend co-operation for effective implementation of the law. She also said that since Tobacco Control Committee has been constituted in every school and village, she urged them to put more effort and to frequently review tobacco related activities and report/submit the activities. The members also reviewed the past activities and upcoming activities to be conducted.

AWARENESS ON LIVELIHOOD GENERATION AND EDUCATION HELD AT WOKHA

This salt was available in abundance in this lake. Hence, this special salt water was collected and used in cooking for community's guests and beloved friends in those days.

It is also said that the Khel community used to observe 'genna' every year by bringing an unblemished and healthy cock to this lake (Sokhriezie), invoking blessings for good fortune and health upon the Tsutuonuomia clan. Etymologically, the word Sokhriezie is derived from the words 'Sokhrie' meaning 'beloved guests' and 'zie' meaning 'lake.' It was named as such because the water of this lake was reserved only for special people -Khel's guests and beloved friends. As a matter of fact, Sokhriezie was and is still a very important place for Tsutuonuomia Khel in varied ways. History proves that ancestors attached great importance to

this place and had protected this historical lake with great care.

Minister, Rural Development, Metsubo Jamir inaugurated Sokhriezie Park at Kohima on 4th December 2020. In his speech, he expressed happiness at the completion of the park and expressed gratitude to the T. Khel members for their generosity so that various developmental activities could be taken up. UPGRADED SUB-STATION INAUGURATED AT DIMAPUR

The upgraded 2×100 MVA Power Sub-Station, Nagarjan, Dimapur which caters to entire Dimapur and Peren districts was formally inaugurated by Advisor, Power, H. Tovihoto Ayemi, on 9th December 2020.

Addressing the inaugural programme, the Advisor thanked the engineers and all the people for their support to enable the Government to fulfil the vision of providing uninterrupted power supply all over Nagaland. He was convinced that with the upgradation of 132/66/33 KV Sub-Station to 2×100 MVA at Nagarjan, the socio-economic condition of the people will also improve. He urged all the officers and staff of the Power Department to work tirelessly with utmost dedication for overall improvement of the society and to create a better tomorrow for future generation. He also sought the support of the people to extend fullest cooperation especially in payment of electricity bill.

Principal Secretary, Power, Er. K. D. Vizo, who also spoke at the function said that the domestic consumption constitutes about 85% of the total consumption and the trend over the last 10 years has shown an increase of 7-10% in the normal demand annually, and by 2021, the power demand of 200MW is expected from industrial initiatives in the State, and by 2021, the State power demand will touch 450MW.

Vizo also maintained that the present installed generation capacity of the State from small

hydro project is 26.74 MW and the bulk of State power requirement is being purchased from the Central PSU generating units operating in the North Eastern Region and Eastern Region. However, due to shortfall of hydro power generation in Eastern Region, the Department is rationing the supply of electricity throughout the State on a rational basis and there is now tremendous pressure to have our own hydro power generation stations, he said and further appealed to the general public to extend cooperation in places where hydro power stations are coming up.

Engineer-in-Chief, Power, Er. Shikato Sema, in his technical report mentioned that DoNER sanctioned Rs. 17.05 crore which could install only one 100MVA, 132/66KV transformer in March 2015 which provided some relief for some time but with rapid load growth, the transformer got overloaded. Further, at the voltage level of 66/33kv, 20MVA transformer got overloaded and one transformer got damaged on 12th November 2017 and to mitigate the power crisis, the State Government sanctioned Rs. 14.96 crore from the State resources and the installation of 100MVA, 132/33kv transformer was completed.

The inaugural programme was chaired by Chief Engineer (D&R), Er. Moa Aier while vote of thanks was proposed by Chief Engineer (T&G), Er. N. Mozhui.

Executive Engineer, Electrical Division, Wokha, Er. Chonrothung Ezung said over the past 15 years, the power demand/consumption has increased, yet on the other side, the power transformer capacity has not been upgraded or augmented, thereby the existing 5 MVA power transformer is fully overloaded and poses a great threat for breakdown any moment. The existing 33/11 K 5MVA power transformer was installed at Power House, Wokha in the year 2005. With the installation of additional 5 MVA, the district will now have 10 MVA. Ezung expressed his optimism that Wokha district will have adequate power supply for at least 10 to 20 years and added that in view of the power transformer constraint and impending risk, the Wokha division requested and apprised the situation to the Chief Engineer (D&R), Nagaland to allot additional 5 MVA power transformer, which the Department allotted on 9th November 2020.

Chief Minister, Neiphiu Rio inaugurated the new Kigwema Village Council Hall building at Kigwema village on 17th December 2020.

Rio highlighted the unique role the Village Councils play in the Naga context, and said that the Indian Constitution respecting the Naga customary laws, exempted the State from Panchayati Raj Institution. He emphasized on the need to protect, uphold and practice the unique customary laws and traditions of the Nagas, and reminded that in Village Council System, leaders are not elected but nominated based on consent of Village Council members. He deplored the conflicts and discords within the Councils and Village Development Board, which he said leads to stalling of projects and dispersal of funds at the village level. Rio further asked the Village Councils to work in unity and avoid litigation of disputes in High Court.

Rio also shared about the difficulties faced by the State Government in planning due to incorrect data and discrepancies in tabulating the Census in the past, which he said has given rise to a number of problems such as excess teachers appointment and also setting up of government schools with disproportionate student-teacher ratio. He said that schools with zero pass percentage in the last three-four years and schools with no students will be combined with other schools. Similarly in the election process, he said Aadhaar based biometric system need to be used to avoid frauds in voting.

Rio emphasized on the importance of selfsufficiency in food production and need for modern farming method, and encouraged the youth to venture into agriculture and allied sectors. Rio, acknowledging the importance of education in development, promised to look into the matter forwarded by the Kigwema village for upgrading the Government High School, Kigwema to higher secondary level, science stream.

Ltd. during 2016. The bridge layout was given during October 2017, after dismantling the old bridge and work commenced, he informed.

Also giving a report of the RCC Girder Bridge over Dhansiri at Nagarian, Dimapur, Mor informed that the project was sanctioned by the same Ministry during July 2015 amounting to Rs. 37.95 crore and work was also awarded to the same firm. Informing that the existing Nagarian Bridge was constructed by the British Government, though no official records are available, it was opined to keep the bridge as a heritage structure. In view of this, the construction of new bridge was relocated at the adjacent land and for which the landowners agreed to provide the land under the initiative of the contractor. The bridge layout was given during October 2017 and with the tireless effort of the contractor, the bridge could be successfully completed, Mor added.
