## THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT OUR NATIONAL FLAG:

- # Whenever the National Flag is on display, it shall occupy the position of honour and should be distinctly placed.
- # The National Flag shall not be displayed in an inverted manner; i. e.; the saffron band should not be the bottom band.
- **# A damaged or dishevelled Flag shall not be displayed.**
- # Where the National Flag is displayed on the house of a public, it may be flown day and night.
- # No other flag or bunting shall be placed higher than or above or side by side with the National Flag.
- # The National Flag shall not be flown at half-mast except on occasions instructed by the Government of India.
- # The National Flag shall not be allowed to touch the ground or the floor or trail in the water.
