- **Training of officers and Functionaries:** Sponsored officers and field functionaries for online and offline training.

## **CENTRALLY SPONSORED SCHEMES (CSS):**

#### **AGRICULTURAL ECONOMICS AND STATISTICS:**

#### **Main Activities:**

- Collect and compile data on area, production and yield of all principal crops.
- Conduct 'Crop Cutting' Survey for yield estimation.
- Collect weekly Weather Watch Report on crop conditions and other factors.
- Compile Agricultural Village Profile data.
- Implemented EARAS with 100% funding the Ministry of Agriculture & Cooperation and Farmers Welfares, Government of India.

#### AGRICULTURE CENSUS:

The Government of India conducts Agriculture Census as part of the World Census of Agriculture (WCA) on recommendation of Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO) of the United Nations.

**Agriculture Census 2021-22 (Phase-I):** Conducted 11 series of the census 2021-22, with State level training for primary workers in September 2022. Completed a digital survey covering 1421 villages in 16 districts and 74 blocks. Phase-I data was provisionally finalised at a workshop in Shillong, Meghalaya. Training for Phase-II and III was also provided. The field survey with 20% sample of villages will start soon.

#### RASHTRIYA KRISHI VIKAS YOJANA (RKVY):

Implemented by the Agri & Allied department along with three Missions, Marketing Board and IFAD-FOCUS covering 89 villages on Cluster basis across all districts and sub-divisions. The scheme is active for 2023-24 to 2024-25, with the Agriculture department as the nodal department.

#### RKVY – DPR

**RKVY – Power Tiller Path (PTP):** Connects fields and other compact cultivated areas with power tiller paths where farmers can move power tillers paths, allowing free movement of farm machineries from link roads to their fields.

**RKVY-Rural Agriculture Market Infrastructure:** Facilitates marginal farmers in selling surplus produce timely and profitably, enhancing the rural economy. Financial assistance provided for marketing sheds and collection stores at strategic cluster areas.

**RKVY – Integrated Pest Management (IPM):** In 2023-24, conducted 38 Farmer's Field School across districts and sub-divisions. Distribution knapsack sprayers, intercultural operations tools and bio-pesticides.

## RKVY – Strengthening of Integrated Extension Training Centre (IETC) and State Agriculture Research Station (SARS):

- IETC: Provides a two years Agriculture Extension course for youths interested in agriculture sector. Organised short-term training with various schemes and institutes like SASRD, ICAR and EEI, Jorhat.
- SARS, Yisemyong: Established in 1988, conducts location-specific research and demonstrations. Located at 1650 m MSL, it has substations in Wokha (1310 m MSL) and Tuli (320 m MSL). Activities

- include tea technology, biodiversity, watershed modelling, paddy germpasm conservation and year-round training for farmers, NGOs and educational institutes
- Experiment & Trails (Kharif and Rabi 2023-24): Trails on various agricultural including mixed intercropping compatibility with SARS-5 Upland Paddy, evaluation of indigenous Finger millets and observation trails on crops like black soybean, buckweed, different maize varieties etc.
- Gene Bank: Maintenance of 254 Rice cultivars in the mini Gene Bank.
- Commercial Seed Production: Mehouro (WRC); Manen Tsuk (Jhum); Sungmangtsuk – (Jhum); Coarse Cereals – Job'stear.

## **Strengthening of Agriculture Laboratories:**

 Bio-Fertilizer Laboratory, Medziphema: Produces 4 - types of Bio-fertilizers.

Besides producing Bio-Fertilizers, also gives training to farmers, students, NGOs, entrepreneurs etc.

- State Agriculture Chemistry Laboratory, Medziphema: Established in 1974, is the department's oldest lab for analyzing soil nutrients (N,P,K), soil pH, organic carbon and micro nutrients from samples collected by various agencies and individual farmers.
- Bio Control Laboratory, Medziphema: Produces five species of Trichogramma for controlling lepidopteran pests as well as Trichoderma harzianum and Pseudomonas flourescens for controlling soil borne diseases. Distributes bio agents to farmers for free through District Agricultural Offices, Sub-Division Offices and Research stations statewide.

- Tissue cultural Laboratory, 4<sup>th</sup> Mile Agri Expo, Chumoukedima: In 2023-24, started to culture Banana (Grand Naine) and Sugarcane (COBLn 9102/Barak) under RKVY.
- Seed Testing Laboratory, Dimapur: Aims to assess seed quality by testing germination capacity, genetic purity and moisture content to provide good quality seeds to farmers. It has the capacity to text 5000 samples per annum.

**RKVY-Tea Development:** Provides financial support for managing tea plantations and developing nurseries. It also assists with the expansion and offers training on the latest practices to tea growers.

**RKVY – Women in Agriculture:** The "Women in Agriculture" program under RKVY Flexi Fund aims to empower wome through knowledge and skill development. Conducted via Self Helf Groups (SHGs) of 15-20 members each, 89 SHGs were selected in 2023-24 from RKVY Cluster Villages across 16 districts and 22 sub-divisions in Nagaland, empowering around 1335 women.

#### **RKVY - APP**

Rainfed Area Development (RAD): Part of the National Mission for Sustainable Agriculture (NMSA), RAD aims to enhance productivity, sustainability and profitability in rainfed areas. In 2023-24, implemented 50 clusters across districts and sub-divisions. Activities included diverse farming systems (Horticulture, livestock, silvipastoral, fishery, cropping) and resource conservation components (apiculture, greenhouses, post-harvest storage, vermi-compost, capacity building). The target was to cover 5100 ha, benefiting approx. 2500 farmers by enhancing sustainable agricultural productivity, capacity development and resilience in rainfed and dry-land areas.

**Sub-Mission on Agricultural Mechanization (SMAM):** Launched in Nagaland in 2014-15, SMAM is covered all districts by 2017-18. In 2023-24, under the RKVY (DPR) and the Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare, SMAM extended to all 16 districts in the State.

- Increased farm power availability from 0.507 kW/ha in 2018-19 to 0.732 kw/ha in 2023-24 (national average of 2.761 kW/ha).
- Distributed tractors, rice/maize mills, power tillers, power cultivators, rotary tiller, brush cutters, earth auger and installed 2 drones for demonstration.

- Provided financial support for machinery procurement via Direct Benefit Transfer.
- Established Agro Servicing Centres statewide since 2017-18 for machinery repairs.
- Set up 38 Farm Machinery Banks with sheds in all the districts and sub-divisions in 2022-23.
- Organised capacity building, training and hands-on demonstrations for farm machinery, celebrating the International Year of Millet 2023.
- Distributed Millet Polisher and Kodo Millet Dehuller to farmers though SMAM.
   Per Drop More Crop-Other Interventions (O.I): Launched under

**Per Drop More Crop-Other Interventions (O.I):** Launched under PMKSY on July 1, 2015, this scheme aims to converge investments in the irrigation sector at the field level. It provides end-to-end solutions for the irrigation supply chain, including water sources, distribution networks and farm-level applications.

- In 2023-24, PMKSY-PDMC was implemented by 2 Departments viz. Agriculture Department implementing Other Intervention (O.I) component and Horticulture Department implementing Micro-Irrigation (M.I) component. Implemented PMKSY-O.I across 50 clusters covering all districts in Nagaland, targeting 3100 ha.
- Activities undertaken, included construction of field channels, water harvesting structures, distribution of pipes, water lifting devices, training, demonstration, field visits, monitoring & evaluation, adm./ contingency, etc under PMKSY-OI, deployment of drip irrigation and sprinkler irrigation under PMKSY-OI.

**Agro Forestry:** Under this scheme, in 2023-24, provided support for setting up of 2 small nurseries under government agency and 7 small nurseries under non-government beneficiary components.

**RKVY-Crop Diversification Programme (CDP):** Activities carried out in 2023-24 included promoting millets cultivation through cluster frontline demonstrations, training on millet-based food products and purchasing of local seeds. Other activities involved: demonstration on intercropping cereals with pulse; relay cropping and plant protection measures.

Krishonnati Yojana (KY):

State Extension Programmes for Extension Reforms (ATMA) Scheme of Sub-Mission on Agricultural Extension (SAME):

- In Nagaland, Extension Reforms were piloted in 2004-05 in Dimapur, Kohima and Mokokchung districts, expanding to all 11 districts by 2010-11, now covering 15 districts (excluding Dimapur). The scheme focuses on awareness creation and the adoption of appropriate technologies in agriculture and allied sectors. ATMA functionaries undergo training for capacity building and skill development to provide effective services to farmers. Activities are conducted in a participatory and demand-driven manner, focusing on the needs of farmers.
- Activities conducted in the State under ATMA during 2023-24: Included training for extension functionaries and farmers, demonstrations, farmers' exposure visits, mobilization of farmers' group, district level exhibition, field days, establishment of farm schools and implementation of capacity building programs like PGDAEM and Farmers' Friend across 15 districts.

#### **National Food Security & Nutrition Mission:**

 Nagaland joined NFSM initiatives starting with NFSM-Rice in 2012-13, followed by NFSM-Pulse, Coarse Cereals and Commercial Crop from 214-15 and NFSM-Nutri Cereals from 2018-19 till date. Interventions include, HYV, Hybrid Rice, cluster demonstrations, training, plant and soil management, resource conservation techniques/tolls, water application tools, cropping system demonstration, seed distribution, integrated nutrient and pest management, efficient water application tools and local initiatives.

#### National Mission on Edible Oils - Oil Palm:

- The State has a target of 15000 ha for five years 2021-22 to 2025-26.
   To target the potential foothill areas of the state without disturbing the natural forest including bio-diversity under Oil palm Act.
- Mou signed with Godrej Agrovet Private Limited during January 2023 for Zone - I (Peren, Chumukedima, Dimapur, Niuland and Wokha districts) and Patanjali Foods Ltd for Zone-II (Mokokchung, Longleng and Mon districts) to develop and expand oil palm cultivation and processing.
- Present Status of Oil Palm Cultivation: Nagaland State:
- Processing Mill proposal approved with site selection completed.

- Seed gardens proposal approved, pending commencement.
- Four Oil palm nurseries established with capacity for 4.00 lakh sprout.

#### National Mission on Edible Oil – Oilseed (NMEO-OS):

- Oilseed cultivation undertaken across Nagaland in about 3000 ha. largely on marginal lands and mainly rainfed farming. Focused on 3 main oilseed crops at present viz Rapeseed and Mustard, Soybean and Groundnut.
- Distributed 79 qtls of groundnut and 80 qntls of soybean, 2.10 qntls
  of Sesame seed mini-kits in all the potential villages under special
  programme to enhance the productivity of oil seeds in the state.

## Mission Organic Value Chain Development for North Eastern Region (MOVCDNER):

#### MOVCDNER major achievements in 2023-24:

- Supplied 10 MT of organic ginger to AYESHA Traders, Odisha by Wokha Land Organic Ginger Producer Company Ltd in April 2023.
- Held State level FPO conclave on 19<sup>th</sup> October 2023 at Angh House Chumoukedima attended by 100 organic farmers from 38 Farmers Producer Organisation.
- Provided fourwheeler transport vehicle to six FPOs i.e Mon Organic Spices Producer Company Ltd., Longleng Organic Producer Company Ltd, Southwest Kohima Organic Producer Company Ltd, Dimapur Spices Producer Company Ltd, Akhoya Organic Farmers Producer Company Ltd and Thanamir.
- Signed MoU Brightcrop Agro, Kolkata West Bengal as a buyer for supplying 20 MT of Organic Foxtail Millets from Tuensang Organic Producer Company and Mon Organic Spices Producer company Limited on the 2<sup>nd</sup> of December 2023
- KANA Organic Producer Company Ltd supplied 20 MT of premium Organic turmeric to SUBH LABH Traders on 21st January 2024.
- Targeted 7500 Ha, for 3 years (2023-26) with 15 Farmers Producer Company (FPCs) under MOVCDNER, for cluster formation, value chain production & processing, marketing & branding.
- Engaged The Green Caravan, COLKS and Green Hills Research and Development as service providers for FPC formation and cluster development under phase-IV, with KVK, ATMA, ICAR & CIH as training partners.

**DIGITAL AGRICULTURE MISSION (DAM):** The Agriculture department's NeGP-A initiative aims to transform farming practices in Nagaland through advanced technologies. DAM focuses on Soil and Water Resource Management, Meteorological Analysis, and Forecasting System using Remote Sensing, GIS Mapping, Mobile-based Technology, Drones, and other emerging tools to revolutionise farming practices in the region.

**PRADHAN MANTRI KISAN SAMMAN NIDHI (PM-KISAN):** Launched on 24th February 2019, the scheme provides Rs. 6000 annually to all farmers regardless of landholding size. The scheme aims to support farmers in purchasing inputs for crop health and better yields. The funds transferred directly from Ministry of Finance, GoI in three instalments. Altogether 2,03,462 farmers in Nagaland have received Rs. 488,11,46,000/- by February 2024. Total beneficiaries registered as on 12th February 2024 is 2,15,340. The e-KYC completed is 1,57,559 (73% of the total registered farmers).

#### KRISHI VIGYAN KENDRA (KVK):

- Hosted by department of Agriculture, Nagaland with 4 KVKs: Kohima, Mokokchung, Tuensang and Mon. The KVK act as agents for technology transfer in agriculture through collaborative efforts with science institutions, universities, etc.

#### **ANIMAL HUSBANDRY & VETERINARY SERVICES**

PRESENT STATUS: As per the Sample Survey Report of 2020-21, the State produces 45.07% (worth ₹ 1022.61 crore) of its total requirement,

resulting in a 54.93% shortfall. Out of this shortfall, imported animal husbandry products worth of ₹ 276.69 crore in monetary terms as shown in the Table:

In order to achieve self-sufficient in meat, milk and eggs in the State, priorities are set and framed to achieve the same within the available resources.

**ANIMAL HEALTH:** Established 11 Veterinary Hospitals, 55 Dispensaries and 100 Veterinary Health Centres and 16 functional QCPS. These institutions provide Veterinary services and consultancy to the livestock

farmers. In 2023-24 establishing 2 more Veterinary Hospitals at Tseminyu and Mangkolemba, including basic medicines and equipment to the various Veterinary Institutions.

**ASSISTANCE TO STATE FOR CONTROL OF ANIMAL DISEASE:** During 2024-25, the Department proposes to vaccinate 25000 bovine populations on HSBQ, 20000 bovines on Lumpy Skin Disease (LSD) and 95000 canines against rabies for prevention against Zoonotic Disease. Capacity building at block level & district levels will be conducted for sensitizing the farmers on disease prevention and control.

**NATIONAL PROGRAMME ON CLASSICAL SWINE FEVER - CONTROL PROGRAMME (2022-23):** Received 3,64,300 doses of CSF vaccine in February 2023; Over 100,000 susceptible population vaccinated.

NATIONAL ANIMAL DISEASE CONTROL PROGRAMME ON FOOT & MOUTH DISEASE (NADCP-FMD): During 2022-23, received 65000 doses of FMD vaccine; Phase-III vaccination and ear tagging with UID completed, data uploaded to INAPH portal.

**BRUCELLOSIS CONTROL PROGRAMME (BCP):** During 2023-24, Received 7010 doses of Brucella vaccine under Phase-III and vaccination is in progress.

MOBILE VETERINARY UNITS (MVU) & CALL CENTRES: Provided 16 Mobile Veterinary Units to districts for on-site veterinary health. Call centres with toll free numbers for animal treatment and management queries.

**BOVINE DEVELOPMENT:** Maintains 5 Cattle Breeding Farms at Lerie, Aliba, Tuensang, Medziphema and Jalukie and 1 Surti Buffalo Farm at Jalukie with another cattle farm upcoming at Pfutsero. At present, straws are imported from ABS Pune, ABS/CRI from USA & NDDB, India for insemination.

**POULTRY DEVELOPMENT:** Operates 9 poultry farms that brood & rear Low Input Technology (LIT) chicks for 21 - 30 days to interested farmers at subsidized rate after vaccination. In 2023-24, the Department could brood approximately 1,75,000 LIT chicks, including varieties like FFG, FFFG and also egg ypes (BV-300) were brooded.

**PIGGERY DEVELOPMENT:** Allocated Rs. 2.00 crores for strengthening pig breeding farms at four locations (PBC Merangkong, PBC Akuluto,

PBC Phek, PBC Tizit) through private participation under the State Plan during 2023-24.

**SMALL ANIMAL DEVELOPMENT:** Focuses on rabbitry, goatery, sheep and pony development. Maintains two State Goat Farms and one State Farm each for sheep, rabbit and pony.

**FODDER DEVELOPMENT:** Emphasizes on growing high nutrition fodder crops, grasses and trees both suitable for the agro-climatic condition. Provides power driven chaff cutters and is establishing a feed manufacturing plant.

**DAIRY DEVELOPMENT:** With the launched of IDDP, Dairy Development in Nagaland is managed by the Nagaland State Dairy Co-operative Federation Ltd. (NSDCF Ltd.), established in 2002 to replicate the "Anand Pattern" (AMUL) model, comprising State, District and Village level structures. The Government of India is implementing the National Plan for Dairy Development, and the state follows these guidelines. Additionally, EDEG/DEDS programs are implemented along with NABARD & Banks to provide credit linkages to the dairy farmers.

**Forest Fire Prevention and Management Scheme (FPM):** The schemes is being extended to all the States and Union Territories during the 12<sup>th</sup> Five Year Plan. It is a 90:10% fund sharing scheme

- Orchidarium: The Division maintains an orchidarium for conservation and propagation of orchid species through in-situ and ex-situ conservation.
- Central Nursery: Located in Kohima, supports seeding for plantations by educational institutions, government departments, NGOs, SHGs and the public. Successfully propagated ginkgo biloba and weeping willow through branch cutting.
- Plant Tissue Culture Lap: Established in 2016, carrying out raising tissue cultured plants of Dipterocarpus macrocarpus and Duabanga grandiflora.

## **FOREST OPERATION:**

### **Timber Operations:**

- Tree Felling Regulation, 2017: Allows villagers to fell and sell timber from private plantations under Forest Department supervision via Transit Permits. Applies to non-forest areas.
- Export Bans: Prohibits exporting round logs below 4 feet girth.
- Mahal System: Continues for forest produce other than timber.
- Free Permit Bans: Prevents revenue loss by banning free permits for timber.
- Committees: State and District Level Committees handle pricing, working schemes and industrial estates notification.

**Wood Based Industries:** Industrial processing wood as raw material, including Saw Mills, Plywood, Veneer, Pulp, Sandalwood and katha wood (excluding furniture units).

**BIODIVERSITY:** Nagaland is in the 10<sup>th</sup> bio-geographic zone, one of the world's 18 Mega hot spots. Its flora and fauna represent a transition zone between Indian, Indo Malayan and Indo Chinese regions. The region hosts ancient angiosperms and primitive flowering plants, considered a cradle of flowering plants. It is also the origin of some rice varieties and a secondary origin for citrus, chilly and maize.

# **Endangered Species of the State:**

- Flora: Endangered flora includes Hollong, Makai, Rhodhodendron, Nahar, Ginseng, Agar and various orchids. The government is implementing conservation measures for these species.
- Fauna: Endangered fauna includes Asian elephants, Sloth Bear, spotted linsang, Tiger, tailed pigs, Indian Bison, Hornbills and Tortoises. These species are at risk due to habitat loss and hunting.
- Community Conservation in Nagaland: Nagaland has 407 documented Community Conserved Areas (CCAs). Of these, 343 (84.3%) are selfinitiated and 62 (15.2%) are initiated by Forest Department.

The Excise and Prohibition Department primarily enforces the NLTP Act, 1989 and NDPS Act, 1985 in the State, focusing on preventive measures, controlling liquor-related activities, and combating smuggling of excisable goods and narcotics. It also regulates opium supply, denatured spirit for industrial use, molasses and co-ordinates with Central Agencies like NCB and Central Bureau of Narcotics.

**CSD/Bonded Warehouses:** The Departments oversees liquor import, export and supply to Military and Para Military Units through Canteen Stores Depot and Para Military Bonded Warehouses at Dimapur.

Narcotic Enforcement under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act 1985: Prohibits the cultivation, possession, transport, import and export of narcotic drugs and psychotropic substances. The Excise Department is authorized to enforce this act in the State

Ayushman BHAV-saturation Coverage of Health Care Services: Ayushman Bhavan is a nationwide healthcare campaign aiming for saturation coverage of services in every village and town in the country. The campaign includes interventions like Ayushman Apke Dwar 3.0 for distribution of Ayushman cards; Ayushman Mela for health awareness and Ayushman Sabha for community engagement. The goal is to ensure all eligible beneficiaries receive healthcare under the PM-JAY Scheme and to improve utilization of healthcare services, with the ultimate aim of achieving 'Ayushman Gram Panchayat or Ayushman Urban Ward' status. Patient to Doctor-it allows patients to consult doctors from the comfort of their homes

**ASHA** (Accredited Social Health Activist): The State has 2139 ASHA of which 1939 are under Rural and 200 are under Urban, selected as Health Volunteer to create awareness, provide counseling and to act

as a depot for basic medicines to meet emergency requirements. 1346 Villages formed Village Health Committees (VHC).

**Mobile Medical Unit and Referral Transport:** 11 MMU and 93 Ambulances provided in the State.

National Quality Assurance Standard (NQAS) – Kayakalp Award: Primary Health Center Chunlikha, Kohima was awarded National Quality Assurance Standard Certification during 2022-23. Taken up construction and up gradation of Infrastructure for district hospitals, CHCs, PHCs and subcenters in all the Districts since the inception of the programme at the State. NATIONAL URBAN HEALTH MISSION (NUHM): Launched in Nagaland on 24<sup>th</sup> February 2014 under NHM. NUHM cover cities and towns with more than 50,000 population as well as District headquarters having population between 30,000 – 50,000, while smaller cities/towns will be covered under National Rural Health Mission. Districts like Kohima, Dimapur, Mokokchung & Tuensang falls under NUHM.

Urban Primary Health Centers approved so far:

#### Payment of Advertisement bills:

The Department handles payments for all advertisement. Official
press releases, notifications and policies/rules are issued through the
Department. The Secretary/Director, Information & Public Relations
serves as the official spokesperson for the Government. Political
statements /releases are not managed by the Department; Statutory
Bodies have their own spokesperson.

## Press Accreditation and strengthening of Media Relations:

• The Department implements the Press Accreditation Rules (Nagaland), 1980. Accredited Journalists receive benefits like insurance and travel concessions. The Department institutionalized media facilitation and welfare programmes such as Nagaland Journalists' Operational Subsidy, amended in October 2018, doubles the monthly subsidy: Journalists with less than 5-years experience - from Rs. 2000 to Rs. 4000, Journalists with more than 5-years experience - from Rs. 3000 to Rs. 6000. As of March 2024, there are 52 State Accredited Journalists.

#### Public Address System:

 The Directorate, DPROs and APROs offices are equipped with PA systems for official functions, meetings, VIP visits and important religious and social functions. Public announcements regarding government notifications, orders and information of public importance are made using this facility.

# **Photo Coverage:**

 The Department provides photo coverage of official events and functions. Photographers are available on short notice and photos are used for press and publications with due credit.

#### Video Coverage:

 The video section covers government functions for record-keeping and for Doordarshan. Videos are regularly uploaded to the Department's YouTube channel and live webcast are conducted for significant events. #### **LABOUR**

#### LABOUR WELFARE CENTRES:

#### Four Labour Welfare Centres established at:

- Nagaland Pulp & Paper Company Ltd, Tuli, Mokokchung district.
- Mini Cement Plant, Wazeho at Phek district.
- 5<sup>th</sup> Mile, Dimapur and
- Doyang Hydro Electric Project, Doyang, Wokha.

These centres offer 8-month training courses in cutting, tailoring, knitting and embroidery sponsored by department for industrial workers' dependents. The best trainee in each trade receives a machine of their trade at the end of every training. In 2023, 34 trainees successfully completed the courses.

Employees' State Insurance (ESI) Scheme: The ESI Scheme, under Employees' State Insurance Act, provides social insurance for employees against sickness, maternity, disablement and employment-related death. It covers establishments with 10+ employees earning upto Rs. 21,000/- a month. Employers Contribute 3.25% of wages and employees contribute 0.75% of wages. The scheme is implemented in Dimapur, Mokokchung and Kohima with 3912 Insured Persons and 302 beneficiaries receiving medical benefits in 2023. Awareness programs and free health camps were conducted in these districts during 2023.

Employees' Provident Fund Organization (EPFO): Established in 1951 under Ministry of Labour and Employment, Govt. of India, the EPFO manages social security savings for workers through the Employees' Provident Fund (EPF), Employees' Pension Scheme (EPS) and Employees' Deposit Linked Insurance (EDLI) Scheme. Both employees and employers contribute 12% of the employee's salary monthly to the EPF account. The EPFO operates digitally with regional offices, including one in Dimapur, Nagaland to promote financial security for workers post-retirement.

**e-SHRAM PORTAL:** Registered workers receive Rs. 2 lakhs accidental insurance cover and a permanent 12 digits Universal Account Number (UAN) for accessing social security schemes nationwide. As of January 2024, around 220980 unorganized workers in the state are registered through the Labour Department and CSCs.

**Nagaland Observes National Safety Day:** The 52<sup>nd</sup> National Safety Day programme was organized in collaboration with Nagaland State Aids Control Society, DH&FW and the Bricks Field Owners Union, Dimapur. The event included an awareness programme on HIV/AIDS and testing for brick field workers. Workers from different brick units received citations and awards for their loyalty and commitment to workplace safety.

**Quasi-Judiciary Functions of The Department:** 

- The Building & Other Construction Workers (RE&CS) Act, 1996:
   Along with the Building and other Construction Workers' Welfare Cess Act, 1996 regulate employment conditions and provide social security measures for construction workers. The State Government frames corresponding rules for effective implementation.
- The Workmen's Compensation Act, 1923: In 2023-24, the Labour Commissioner settled 4 claims totaling Rs.51,23,800/- compensation.
- The Minimum Wages Act, 1948: Effective June 14, 2019, the minimum wage rates set by the State Government are: Skilled Labour - Rs.235/-; Semi-Skilled Labour - Rs.210; Unskilled - Rs.176/-.
- The Trade Unions Act, 1926: This Act grants workers the right to form unions to address exploitation. Genuine workers' unions are registered under the Labour department in Nagaland, adhering to the Act's provisions and State regulations. The department monitors registered unions to ensures compliance with constitutions and government directives.
- Nagaland Shops & Establishments Act, 1986: Employer must register their shops and establishments with registration renewed every 12 months.
- The Factories Act, 1948: Registration and licensing are mandatory under the Act. The department faces challenges in registering units due to the absence of Nagaland Factory Rules. Most factories are in the foothills bordering Assam.
- The Indian Boilers Act, 1923: Along with the Indian Boilers Regulation 1950 and Nagaland Boiler Rules, 1996, this Act is enforced by the department. It conducts periodical inspections and inspections after major/minor repairs and replacements of boilers and thermic fluid heaters.

- Child and Adolescent Labour (Prohibition and Regulation) Act, 1986: Prohibits children under 14 years from working and mandates free education. Employment in hazardous occupations is prohibited until age 18 after the amendment. The department participates in Child Labour programs, organizes awareness campaigns and has formed a Task Force in child labour endemic districts to provide technical training.
- The Industrial Disputes Act, 1947: Provides for investigation and settlement of industrial disputes.
- Functions of the Industrial Tribunal: Section 7(A) mandates that the State government appoint a Presiding Officer to oversee industrial disputes related to the Third Schedule of the Act.
- Functions of the Labour Court: Industrial disputes specified in the Second Schedule that cannot be settled through reconciliation are referred to the Labour Court for adjudication.

Other activities include soil sample collection, soil survey and investigation.

- Water Quality Lab: Established a level 1+ Water Quality Laboratory in Dimapur to provide water quality data for better policy and decision making.
- State Water Informatics Centre (SWIC): Signed an MOA with National Water Informatic Centre (NWIC), on 7<sup>th</sup> July 2022 to establish SWIC as the state's Water Data Repository, focusing on data collection, standardization, analysis and dissemination.
- The Department is carrying out a study on "Development of Flood Forecasting Model in Dhansiri River, Nagaland" with RMSI Private Limited, New Delhi to develop a flood forecasting system in Dhansiri river, Dimapur.
- Also carrying out a study on "Alleviating Water Logging Problem in Critical Areas of Dimapur" with Alluvium International Pvt. Ltd. Australia.

**CAPACITY BUILDING:** Officers and staff trained on various topics in Guwahati, Kohima and Tezpur. Exposure visits to successful projects in neighbouring Districts and States for sharing experiences during 2023-24.

#### **ACHIEVEMENT DURING 2023-24:**

- Created 9117 Ha of Irrigation Potential out of 10508 Ha proposed under 270 MI Schemes (PMKSY-Har Khet Ko Pani), completing 231 projects and the remaining to be completed by year-end.
- Created 1585 Ha of Irrigation potential out of 6837.30 Ha proposed under 213 MI Schemes (PMKSY-Har Khet Ko Pani) completing 19 projects.
- Completed the State Data Centre Building and Hydrology Project Convention Centre under National Hydrology Project for data management and departmental events.

- Turmeric Processing Programme: Based in Jalukie Town, processing raw turmeric into dry fingers. Provided assistance and training to 42 beneficiaries. Expected harvest: 60 -70 MT, exploring marketing tie-ups, including NSAMB, Dimapur.
- Apparel & Accessories Production Programme: Outsourced production to skilled unemployed women for income generation. Products available at Myki Store, Kohima and Kuda Village, Dimapur at reasonable rates. Ongoing short-term training for 2023-24 activities included: skill development, embroidery, basic beads making, pattern making, cutting & tailoring for 12 beneficiaries. Engaged 10 women on pay-per-production basis with 4 new candidates under review. Approximately 70 products marketed under Myki Nagaland brand select outlets in Nagaland.

- Food processing & Resource Centre: Processes local raw materials from women farmers and SHGs. Fourteen products registered under FSSAI and marketed under the Myki brand. 2023-24 activities include: Training 20 beneficiaries on food processing (pickling) and supporting 100 women engaged in Myki products.
- Resource Development Programme for Women: During 2023-24, provided Financial/Materials resources to 824 women beneficiaries in various programmes/activities including farmers, small entrepreneurs and artisans

# MULTI TRAINING CENTRES (MTC), KOHIMA AND DIMAPUR:

 Provides 6-month training on tailoring, knitting and also soft skilling and hairstyling. 2023-24 activities included - Trained 12 beneficiaries on knitting, cutting & tailoring and 25 beneficiaries on soft skills & hairstyling in Kohima. Trained 14 beneficiaries on knitting, cutting & tailoring and 20 on soft skills & hairstyling in Dimapur.

# INTEGRATED DEVELOPMENT-CUM-RESOURCE CENTRE (IDRC):

 In 2023-24, launched new support programme for women, including competitive exams grant (NPSC/NSSB) for 10 beneficiaries; Scholars grant for higher studies (PhD/specialization) for 8 beneficiaries and New Entrepreneurship Fund for 6 beneficiaries.
