FINANCE DEPARTMENT SIGNS MOU WITH SBI TO ENHANCE SALARY BENEFITS FOR GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES

The Finance Department, Government of Nagaland, signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the State Bank of India (SBI) on 27th March 2025 for the State Government Salary Package (SGSP) for enhancement of features to provide enhanced salary package benefits to permanent State Government employees operating their salary accounts with SBI.

Key Highlights of the State Government Salary Package include:

- 1. The Government employees' family is entitled to Accidental Insurance Cover up to ₹ 1 crore in case of accidental death.
- 2. Air Accidental Insurance Cover up to ₹ 2.1 crore in case of accidental death of the Government employee.
- 3. Disability cover up to ₹ 1 crore in case of permanent total disability.
- 4. Disability cover up to ₹ 80 lakh in case of permanent partial disability.
- 5. Group term life insurance up to ₹ 10 lakh
- 6. Child Education Benefit: applicable on the admissibility of Personal Accidental Insurance (Death) cover
- 7. Girl Child's Marriage Benefit: applicable on the admissibility of Personal Accidental Insurance (Death) cover.
- 8. Other add-on covers for plastic surgery in case of burns, import of medicines, ambulance charges, transportation of mortal remains, etc.
- 9. SBI RISHTEY, which includes a Family Savings account for up to 4 family members, with Personal Accidental Insurance cover of ₹ 5 lakh each for all RISHTEY A/C holders (except minors).

These benefits are to be provided free of cost to the beneficiaries. The MoU covers the employees already having a Salary account with SBI.

All Government employees have been requested to verify their accounts with the banks for coverage under the Account type SGSP and insist on conversion. For those government employees who have already been converted to SGSP, the variant of account/category based on the net salary may be confirmed with the respective home branch.

DoH & FW PERMISSION TO USE PUBLIC HEALTH FACILITIES BY PRIVATE NURSING/ ALLIED & HEALTHCARE INSTITUTES FOR CLINICAL TRAINING OF STUDENTS

The department of Health & Family has stated that in pursuance of the administrative approval conveyed vide letter No. IIFW-1I/B/50/NURSING/2024/238 dated 2nd April 2025, duly recognized Private Nursing/Allied & Healthcare Institutes shall be permitted to use Public Health Facilities for the purpose of Clinical Training of Students w.e.f. from Academic Year 2025-26, subject to the following terms & conditions:

- 1. Each Private Nursing/ Allied & Healthcare Institute in turn shall allocate 10% of the total annual intake capacity to the department for government quota.
- 2. Fees such as College or Tuition or management fees etc. to be paid by the students must be subsidised at a rate of 50%.
- 3. The department shall not be responsible to provide any resources for the Clinical training.
- 4. The private medical institute shall be responsible for fulfilment & compliance of the regulations of respective Councils- Indian Nursing Council, Indian Pharmacy Council, National Commission for Allied and Healthcare Profession, etc.
- 5. The department shall not be liable for omission or commission of negligence by the students and the private medical institute shall recover damage caused to any assets of the public health facilities by the students.
- 6. The private medical institute shall indemnify the public health facilities against any claims or damages arising from the students' actions or omissions.
- 7. The students shall not interfere with or disrupt the normal functioning of the public health facilities,
- 8. The students shall respect patient care activities and prioritize patient safety and confidentiality.
- 9. The students shall adhere to the rules, regulations, and protocols of the public health facilities.
- 10. The private medical institute shall ensure that students are supervised and guided by qualified faculty members during clinical training.
- 11. The department shall not be obligated for employment of the students.
- 12. The private medical institute shall be responsible to inform the department of any enhancement of Scats.
- 13. The Department or private medical institute reserves the right to cancel/ terminate the UNDERTAKING by issuing a I (one) month Notice.

Recognized Private Nursing/Allied & healthcare Institutes may submit the Application along with 2 (two) copies or UNDERTAKING in the prescribed format (enclosed herein as Annexure: I) printed in Rs. 100 (Rupees one hundred only) Non-Judicial Stamp Paper and support documents such as Registration Certificate of the Society/ Trust/ Incorporation/ Proprietorship; Approval/ Permission issued by the respective Council; Consent/ NOC for Affiliation issued by the respective University-' Board; Prospectus; Fee Structure etc., to the Principal Director, Directorate of Health & Family Welfare, Nagaland Kohima for allocation of a suitable Public Health Facilities conforming the requirements of respective Council for the purpose of Clinical Training of Students.

The application must be submitted through the concerned Medical Superintendent (in case of District Hospital) or Chief Medical Officer (in ease of Community Health Centre).

The concerned Private Nursing/Allied & Healthcare Institute shall be responsible to complete the Notarization process of the UNDERTAKING upon approval of the Application.

The permission is issued solely for the purpose of enabling the institute to utilize designated Public Health Facilities for Clinical Training, subject to compliance with the terms stated above and any future directives issued by the department.

DON & RE CONSTITUTES TECHNICAL VETTING COMMITTEE

In compliance with the Government Notification NO.NRE/GEN-1/110/2025/216, Dated Kohima, dated 9th April 2025, the Department of New & Renewable Energy, Nagaland has been authorized as the State Nodal Agency (SNA) for all Renewable Energy (RE) Projects/ Works in Nagaland.

As such, in the effort to maintain quality control, guarantee legitimacy, and compliance with the Ministry of New and Renewable Energy-approved standard and BIS statutory technical norms. - 2. The Chairman and Members shall be paid a fixed honorarium of Rs. 50,000/- & Rs. 40,000/- per month.

The Department of Higher Education has informed to all the Educational Institutions and Students that the timeline for the Academic Session 2025-26 in respect of the CSS-Post Matric Scholarship (PM ST) for the ST students of Nagaland via the National Scholarship Portal (NPS) ie. https://scholarship.gov.in and the State Merit & Research Scholarship via the Common Scholarship Portal (CSP) i.e, https://scholarship.nagaland.gov.in is to be followed as:-

The process of registration for the students is from 7th July 2025 till the 30th September, 2025. The process of completion of verification by the institutes is 31st October 2025. The process of correction of defective applications by the students & the institutes is 15th November 2025, and the process of completion of verification by the state is 30th November 2025.

DoAH & VS ISSUES ADVISORY ON AFRICAN SWINE FEVER

In view of the ongoing outbreak of African Swine Fever (ASF) in Nagaland, the Department of Animal Husbandry & Veterinary Sciences has strongly advised all pig farmers and stakeholders to adopt the following precautionary measures to prevent the spread of the disease:

What is ASF?

- A highly contagious viral disease affecting domestic and wild pigs.
- 100% mortality once infected.
- No available vaccine or treatment.

Transmission:

- Through direct contact with infected pigs, pork, or contaminated feed, water, clothing, tools, vehicles, and equipment.
- Human movement and illegal transportation of pigs/pork also contribute to spread.

Symptoms to Watch For:

- High fever, loss of appetite
- Weakness and sudden death
- Red or blue blotches on skin (especially ears, abdomen)
- Diarrhea, vomiting, coughing, or difficulty in breathing

Mandatory Biosecurity Measures:

- Do not introduce new pigs into your farm without proper quarantine.
- Avoid contact with other farms or animals.
- Regularly disinfect pig pens, equipment, and clothing.
- Restrict entry of outsiders and vehicles into farm premises.
- Report any sudden death or signs of illness in pigs to the nearest Veterinary Centre immediately.
- Do not slaughter, consume, or sell sick or dead pigs.
- Dispose of carcasses safely as per veterinary advice.

Important:

- Farmers are urged to remain alert and strictly follow all advisories issued by the Department of Animal Husbandry & Veterinary Services.
- Cooperation of every farmer is crucial to contain the spread of ASF in the state.
- For any support or to report suspected cases, contact your nearest Veterinary Officer.

Ozukum, in his address, expressed gratitude for the debut recital by The Sunshine Orchestra, Nagaland Chapter, calling it a celebration of talent and progress since the MoU signed in 2019 with Dr. A.R. Rahman, under the initiative of Chief Minister Dr. Neiphiu Rio. He noted this as a milestone for TaFMA, the A.R. Rahman Foundation, and the Orchestra.

He praised TaFMA for revolutionizing Nagaland's music scene and inspiring a generation of musicians who have put Naga music on the national and global map. Highlighting the AR Rahman Foundation's mission to train underprivileged children,

he thanked the Foundation for extending the initiative to Nagaland. Encouraging the children, he urged them to value the opportunity, stay committed to their musical journey, and be grateful to TaFMA and the Foundation.

Chairman, TaFMA, Theja Meru who proposed the welcome address also highlighted that The Sunshine Orchestra, Nagaland Chapter comprised of children from Kohima Orphanage and Destitute Home was launched in 2019 by Chief Minister, Dr. Neiphiu Rio and today they have 20 children altogether in the Orchestra.

The evening was entertained with musical recital performed by the nine violin students of The Sunshine Orchestra, Nagaland Chapter led by their Director, Vilhou Kezo and pianist Kecha Pfukri, special number was presented by Zavino Nakhro and a piano recital by Wenwen.

'FOCUS, NAGALAND' PROJECT COMPLETION WORKSHOP HELD

Fostering Climate Resilient Upland Farming System in the Northeast (FOCUS), NAGALAND project completion workshop was held at De Oriental Grand Hotel, Kohima on 3rd June 2025.

APC & Mission Director, FOCUS, Wezope Kenye, IAS in his remark stated that it is a significant milestone for the successful completion of the Fostering Climate Resilient Upland Farming Systems in the Northeast (FOCUS) project in the State of Nagaland. He said that this achievement is the result of a shared vision, collaborative spirit, and the determination of all stakeholders who have contributed to the project's success.

Kenye highlighted that FOCUS is Nagaland's first Externally Aided Project (EAP) in agriculture, implemented with IFAD. Recognizing agriculture as vital for economic growth and rural development, the project has brought transformative change, benefiting over 1.18 lakh households across 645 villages in 9 districts. Launched in January 2018 and extended due to COVID-19, FOCUS has improved incomes, built climate resilience, and empowered farming communities. It also developed key infrastructure like market access facilities, seed banks, and refrigerated vans to boost rural livelihoods.

State Project Director FOCUS, Ramnikant Kumar, IAS, announced the successful conclusion of a six-year project aimed at transforming upland farming in Nagaland. He said the project improved sustainable land use and boosted incomes for 1.18 lakh households, reaching 86% (1,02,245) through interventions like jhum cultivation, value chain development, and market access. It also produced key technical materials, procurement guidelines, resource maps, and sectoral data.

Country Programme Analyst, IFAD CO, Piyush Kanal also presented a slide deck highlighting on the activities of the project.

NSDMA VISITS PHESAMA VILLAGE; EXTENDS SUPPORT

In response to the recent landslide and its ongoing impact, officials from the Nagaland State Disaster Management Authority (NSDMA), under the Home Department, visited Phesama Village and extended financial relief to address immediate concerns on 3rd June 2025. During the visit, discussions were also held with the Phesama Village Council to assess emergency needs and coordinate ongoing support.

Meanwhile. the District Disaster Management Authority (DDMA), Kohima, is working on modalities to extend relief materials to truckers stranded due to the landslide. The initiative is being undertaken in collaboration with the Sub-Divisional Officer (Civil), Jakhama, and the Phesama Youth Organization.

In addition, the DDMA Kohima and the Phesama Youth Organization are jointly identifying individuals whose properties have been affected by the landslide. Relief measures will be extended to these affected families based on the assessments.

Coordinated efforts are underway to ensure timely assistance to both residents and those impacted by the disruption.

RARE HISTORICAL PHOTOGRAPH PRESENTED TO THE GOVERNOR OF NAGALAND BY DIPR

In a significant gesture to preserve and honour the cultural heritage of Nagaland, Advisor for Information & Public Relations and Soil & Water Conservation, Imkong L Imchen, along with Director of Information & Public Relations, Kohima, Dzüvinuo Theünuo and Joint Director, IPR, Asangla Imsong, on behalf of the Department of Information & Public Relations (DIPR), presented a rare historical photograph to the Governor of Nagaland, La Ganesan, on 4th June 2025 at Raj Bhavan, Kohima.

The photograph, believed to have been taken in the early 1900s, captures a large gathering of people, likely from a central Tenyimia village, in what appears to be a traditional or communal setting. While the exact date, event and identities of those featured remain unknown, the image holds immense historical and ethnographic value. The photographer is unidentified, and the photograph itself was previously unpublished, making it a rare and unique archival piece.

NAGALAND SETS THE PACE IN NATION-WIDE VKSA CAMPAIGN, MOBILIZES OVER 70,000 FARMERS ACROSS 746 VILLAGES IN A WEEK

Nagaland has set a remarkable pace in the ongoing Viksit Krishi Sankalp Abhiyan (VKSA), emerging as a frontrunner in agricultural technology outreach, team visits, village coverage, and farmer mobilization. From 29th May to 5th June 2025, the state successfully engaged 70,169 farmers across 746 villages, demonstrating an exemplary model of community-led participation under the national vision of Viksit Bharat@2047.

This transformative campaign is 'reaching the unreached' in the remotest villages, ensuring that 'no farmer is left behind'. It has seen the active involvement of farmers, farm women, rural youth, selfhelp groups (SHGs), and farmer producer organizations (FPOs), highlighting the spirit of inclusivity and collective progress in the state. Nagaland's progress is evident, with 35,507 male and 30,867 female farmers participating in awareness activities, technical interaction between farmers. scientists and state government officials, distribution of extension literatures and question-answer sessions.

The farmers participation remained high throughout the week, with over 10,000 farmers joining on 3rd and 4th June, underscoring the success of field-level planning and community mobilization. Additionally, three MLAs, MP, and Deputy Commissioners of every district, ICAR Director and Joint Director and, Dean of CAU and SAS graced the campaign with their presence, enhancing its visibility and support from state policymakers, administrators and technocrats. Nagaland, known for its rich biodiversity and traditional farming system, holds immense potential for integrating improved agricultural technologies with indigenous knowledge systems.

The VKSA campaign leverages this unique strength to promote sustainable agriculture, enhance food and income security, and move toward self-reliance of the state in the agriculture and allied sectors. Community participation is the cornerstone of the campaign's success. The people of Nagaland farmers, youth, women, and rural institutions like Village Councils have shown commendable ownership of this mission, turning the campaign into a grassroots movement.

The VKSA campaign goes beyond mobilization; it is a visionary push for transforming Indian agriculture through innovation, inclusivity, and sustainability, aligned with the SDGs and India's fivetrillion-dollar economy goal. Nagaland

stands out as a model of how Viksit Krishi can lead to Viksit Bharat. As the campaign runs until 12th June, more milestones are expected, reflecting a strong, farmer-driven movement to boost the state's agricultural economy.

MP SUPONGMEREN JAMIR VISITS LANDSLIDE AFFECTED AREA AT PHESAMA

Member of Parliament, Lok Sabha, S. Supongmeren Jamir visited the landslideaffected area under Phesama Village, Kohima on 7th June 2025 accompanied by the Joint Secretary of NHIDCL, SDO (Civil) Jakhama, Additional SP of Kohima, and officials from NHIDCL.

A portion of National Highway-2 (NH-2) was completely washed out due to the landslide, cutting off a vital link for southern Angami region and the neighbouring state of Manipur.

During the visit, Jamir stressed the

urgent need to restore the damaged road and ensure the safety of commuters. He urged NHIDCL to expedite the work and take immediate steps to resume connectivity.

Officials also conducted a survey to explore alternative road options to help ease the transport issues caused by the landslide.

Jamir also met the Phesama Village Council and appreciated their ongoing efforts in responding to the situation. He assured the villagers and local organisations to press higher authorities for faster action and necessary support.

COFFEE CANVAS: CAPTURING THE JOURNEY OF COFFEE FROM FARM TO THE GLOBAL MARKET HELD AT KOHIMA

The Department of Land Resources in collaboration with The Coffee Board of India & AIC-CCRI-CED organised the Coffee Canvas under the theme" A journey from Farm to Global Market" at the Capital Cultural Hall, Kohima on 9th June 2025

MLA and Advisor for Land Resources, G. Ikuto Zhimomi, highlighted coffee's global importance as the second most consumed beverage after water, with over 2.25 billion cups consumed daily. He noted Nagaland's growing role in Northeast India's coffee scene, praising the state's unique flavour and sustainable cultivation practices. He said Nagaland has immense potential for coffee cultivation, revealing that approximately 10.4 lakh hectares which is 62.7% of the state's total geographical area are suitable for coffee. However, only 11,186.78 hectares about 1.08% has been utilised so far.

Zhimomi also spoke on the international accolades earned by Nagaland coffee, which has drawn praise for its distinct taste. At the Aurora International Taste Challenge (AITC) in South Africa, Nagaland Coffee won a silver in 2021 and a gold in 2023 for its naturally processed coffee from the Nagaland Washing Station. He emphasized that Nagaland coffee is transitioning from a commodity to a specialty product, now officially recognized as the state's Unique Selling Point, reflecting the dedication of local farmers and stakeholders.

Advisor Zhimomi highlighted economic benefits of coffee cultivation Nagaland, citing opportunities plantations, processing, eco-tourism, and coffee-themed cafés. He said the industry could create jobs across the value chain from baristas to tour guides while and contributing sustainable development. He described the 'Coffee Canvas' event as a platform for farmers, entrepreneurs, and innovators to explore trends in processing, branding, and marketing. He encouraged entrepreneurs to build globally recognized coffee brands that empower local communities and boost the state's revenue.

Director, Land Resources and CEO, SLNA, Albert Ngullie stated that in 2014, the department, in collaboration with the Coffee Board of India, began efforts to revive existing plantations and expand area coverage under coffee cultivation, considering the highly favourable agro-climatic conditions for the healthy growth of both Arabica and Robusta varieties in the state. The department has set a long-term target of expanding to 50,000

hectares by 2047, in line with India's 100 years of independence, he added.

Ngullie stated coffee is being promoted under three core principles: Ecology, Employment, and Economy. It is grown as an agro-forestry crop with minimal undergrowth clearing and discourages slash-and-burn practices and has become a source of livelihood across the value chain, from plantation to retail for Nagaland's youth. With its high export potential, Nagaland coffee is now developed across the full value chain, including processing, roasting, packaging, and marketing.

Currently, only 8% (around 863 hectares) is in the harvesting stage, yielding about 195.4 metric tonnes. However, production is expected to increase significantly in the next two years as more plantations mature. The department has also set up 16 coffee cafes, 12 washing stations, and 7 roasteries, and conducts regular training and exposure trips.

Commissioner & Secretary of the Department of Land Resources, Dr. G. Hukugha Sema, IRS, delivered the welcome address, followed by a brief on *Coffee Canvas* by Partha Pratim Choudary, Joint Director (Extension), Coffee Board, NE Region.

The event also witnessed a technical session on Introduction to AIC-CCRI-CED & SDC by Ashvik K.S., Incubation Manager, AIC-CCRI-CED; Session on Coffee Exports by Dr. Babu Reddy, Deputy Director (Market Research), Coffee Board of India; Presentation on Digital Printing and Packaging by Ramneek Hora and the HP Team Session on Brand Management by Ashish, Founder of We Brand Coffee and Hora Arts, New Delhi (Vendor of HP), and Live Coffee Brewing Demonstration (Manual & Machine Methods) by the Coffee Quality Division, Eté Coffee.

VIKSIT NAGALAND FOR VIKSIT BHARAT @2047

A high-level deliberation on Viksit Nagaland for Viksit Bharat @2047 and related matters was convened on 10th June 2025 at the State Banquet Hall, Chief Minister's Residential Complex, Kohima. In a landmark first for the State, the meeting brought together the full spectrum of Nagaland's top leadership and administrative machinery. Attendees included all 60 elected Legislators led by the Chief Minister, the Chief Secretary of Nagaland, senior police officials headed by the Director General of Police, all Administrative Heads of Departments (AHoDs) and Heads of Departments (HoDs), along with the Deputy Commissioners and Superintendents of Police from all 17 districts of the State, as well as other key government functionaries.

Describing the event, Chairperson Development the programme and Aier. Commissioner, Temsunaro IAS highlighted it as a pivotal gathering of policymakers, unified in their commitment to shaping a dynamic and progressive future for Nagaland.

In his address, Chief Minister of Nagaland, Dr. Neiphiu Rio, offered a brief historical perspective on the origins of the Naga movement and the implementation of the Inner Line Permit (ILP) system. He also reflected on the financial landscape of the State prior to 1989, noting that the financial year once began with a zero-deficit budget.

Dr. Rio highlighted Nagaland's unique governance structure at the grassroots level, where the Village Councils Act of 1978 serves in place of the Panchayati Raj system adopted by other States. He emphasized the importance of the efficient implementation

of Centrally Sponsored Schemes, urging all departments to work diligently and ensure the timely utilization of allocated funds. Failure to do so, he cautioned, would compel the State to return unspent funds with interest to the Central Government.

Acknowledging the various challenges currently facing the State, both societal and administrative, he called for unity among the Naga people. He encouraged collective effort and a spirit of teamwork to advance the shared goal of achieving Viksit Nagaland in alignment with the national vision of Viksit Bharat @2047.

Dr. Rio also advised administrative officers and Village Councils to exercise vigilance and adhere strictly to existing laws and regulations, particularly regarding the issuance of Indigenous Inhabitant Certificates. He stressed the need for thorough verification to avoid future complications or unintended consequences.

Deputy Chief Minister for Planning & Transformation and National Highways, T.R. Zeliang, in his address to the august gathering, highlighted two of the State's flagship initiatives: the Chief Minister's Health Insurance Scheme (CMHIS) and the Chief Minister's Micro Finance Initiative (CMMFI). Speaking on the CMHIS, Zeliang described it as a landmark scheme aimed at achieving universal health coverage for all citizens of Nagaland. He noted that the initiative reflects the Government's unwavering commitment to building a resilient and inclusive healthcare system, ensuring the well-being of every citizen.

Dwelling on the Chief Minister's Micro Finance Initiative (CMMFI), Zeliang emphasized its role in promoting selfemployment and economic self-reliance, particularly among the youth. The initiative, he explained, is designed to support farmers and budding entrepreneurs by offering accessible and subsidized credit. He concluded by calling on all stakeholders to actively support and promote these transformative schemes, underscoring their potential to bring about meaningful, longterm development and prosperity for the people of Nagaland.

Deputy Chief Minister, Home & Border Affairs, Y. Patton, in his address, highlighted three critical issues requiring immediate attention: the Protected Area Permit (PAP), Inner Line Permit (ILP), and Free Movement Regime (FMR). He stressed that reforming these systems was essential for the overall welfare and security of the State. While recognizing the recent implementation of the ILP in the districts of Dimapur, Chumoukedima and Niuland, Patton expressed the government's openness to constructive suggestions from the public to enhance and strengthen the ILP system further. In his closing remarks, he emphasized the importance of safeguarding Article 371(A), asserting that it was crucial to ensure the protection of the rights and freedoms of the Naga people from external interference.

Chief Secretary, Nagaland, Dr. J Alam, IAS shared his experiences in the NITI Aayog meeting held in New Delhi. He gave a presentation on Viksit Nagaland for Viksit Bharat @ 2047, highlighting the Nagaland Index Map on key parameters and its resources to drive growth. He emphasized the State's rich oil and mineral deposits, abundant natural resources, natural and human resources supported by a strong demographic dividend and creative economy.

The guiding principles to be adopted and addressed for Nagaland to become Viksit Nagaland falls in the following areas; Zero poverty, Population management & HRD, Skilling & Employment, Water scarcity, Farmer Agri- Tech, Creative economy & Product perfection, Improvement in health and education indicator digital innovation, transformation & Swachh Nagaland and inclusive infrastructure development.

He further highlighted the following as key economic growth drivers for Viksit Urbanisation and Nagaland: regional development, Tourism & Creative economy, Agriculture Innovation & Technology, Service Hub, Mines & Minerals based industries sustainability and green economy.

Detailed theme presentations with the latest data were also presented on the following topics: Strengthening Governance System from Grassroots Upwards by Home Commissioner Vyasan R, IAS; Sensitization and Integration of Customary Laws in Governance by Principal Secretary, Law & Justice Y. Kikheto Sema, IAS; Chief Minister's Micro Finance Initiative (CMMFI) by Principal Secretary Finance Department Taliremba Ao; Chief Minister's Health Insurance Scheme (CMHIS) by Operations Manager, Nagaland Health Protection Alongla; Strengthening Start-Society, up Ecosystem by Secretary, Industries & Commerce, Kumar Ramnikant, IAS.

The theme presentations were followed by a thorough deliberative session wherein the administrative machinery and the policy makers discussed in detail important and pertaining issues related to the topics highlighted under the theme presentations.

Concluding the day-long deliberation,

Chief Minister, Dr. Neiphiu Rio, in his closing remarks, stated that the State cannot proceed with the exploration and exploitation of oil and natural gas until the court delivers a clear and definitive verdict. Citing a Geology & Mining survey, he noted the potential discovery of rare earth minerals during the extraction of oil and gas in the State.

Referring to the Village Councils Act of 1978, he urged village authorities to promptly submit relevant cases to the administrative officers for decisions in accordance with government rules and regulations. He stressed the need for regular consultations at all levels and called on the administrative and police authorities to exercise their powers efficiently.

Rio also proposed organizing awareness campaigns, recommending that all administrative officers, police personnel, and staff from the Directorates participate actively.

On the matter of customary laws, he mentioned that an Apex Court would be established to ensure swift and cost-effective justice.

Regarding the Inner Line Permit (ILP) and the Register of Indigenous Inhabitants of Nagaland (RIIN), he advocated for a digital and online system, emphasizing the shared responsibility between Village Councils and District Administrations. He called on citizens to act responsibly by reporting any foreign visitors to the nearest police station.

DoH & FW REAFFIRMING COMMITMENT TO A TOBACCO-FREE WORKPLACE

The Directorate of Health & Family Welfare, Kohima, Nagaland, on 11th June 2025, reaffirmed its commitment to maintaining a Tobacco-Free Office through a formal observance program held at the Directorate's lobby.

In accordance with Notification No. MED-5/11/92/(Pt)/24 dated 25th January 2023, whereby the Government of Nagaland officially declared the Directorate as a Tobacco-Free Zone, a circular was subsequently issued reaffirming this status and directing all staff to comply with the tobacco-free guidelines.

Commissioner & Secretary, H&FW Department Anoop Khinchi, IAS, delivered a strong call for strict compliance. Dr. Mereninla Senlem, Director & HOD (DH&FW), provided a comprehensive overview of the Tobacco-Free Office Guidelines. Dr. Arenla Walling,

Additional Director (Dental) & SNO (NTCP), highlighted key provisions of the Cigarettes and Other Tobacco Products Act (COTPA), 2003. The program concluded with a pledge ceremony.

The program strongly emphasized the harmful effects of tobacco use—linked to cancers, cardiovascular diseases, and respiratory illnesses. With 43% of adults in Nagaland reported as tobacco users (as per GATS-2), the urgency of promoting a tobacco-free, health-oriented workplace was underlined.

In line with the Government Order, an Anti-Tobacco Committee has been constituted, with representation from various sections of the Directorate. This Committee is responsible for enforcement, awareness generation, compliance monitoring, and policy recommendations to further Vol-54 No.4

strengthen the Tobacco-Free initiative. Clear signage indicating "No Smoking" and "Tobacco-Free Zone" has already been installed across the premises for all to see and adhere to.

The Directorate of Health & Family Welfare, Kohima urges all officers, staff, and visitors to extend their full cooperation in upholding the Tobacco-Free Office Policy, thereby setting a model example for other institutions across the state.

NORTHEAST NSS FESTIVAL 2025 KICKS OFF IN NAGALAND

The Northeast National Service Scheme (NSS) Festival 2025 officially commenced on 11th June at Dzüü Resort, Rüsoma Village, Kohima. Organized by the NSS Cell under the Directorate of Youth Resources & Sports, Government of Nagaland, in collaboration with the Regional Directorate of NSS, Guwahati, and sponsored by the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, Government of India, the festival is being held under the national theme "Viksit Bharat."

The week-long celebration, took place from 10th to 14th June, brings together 300 NSS volunteers and officials from across the eight northeastern states.

In his address, Nagaland Chief Minister Dr. Neiphiu Rio described the festival as a "celebration of unity in diversity" and a vital platform for youth engagement, cultural exchange, and leadership. three-day training programme for District Level Master Trainers on the implementation of the Holistic Progress Card (HPC) in the Foundational and Preparatory stages was conducted at the State Council of Educational Research and Training (SCERT), Kohima, from June 11 to 13, 2025.

The initiative was undertaken under the guidance of Prof. Indrani Bhaduri, Head and CEO of PARAKH, NCERT, aiming to equip key educational personnel from across the state with the knowledge and skills required to roll out the HPC framework in government schools.

Participants include personnel from SCERT, District Institutes of Educational Training (DIETs), Educational Block Resource Centre (EBRC) coordinators, and Trainers of Teachers (ToTs) from the School Education Department. Representatives from Samagra Shiksha and The Lighthouse Project – NECTAR are also taking part in the training. The sessions are being facilitated by expert resource persons from PARAKH, NCERT.

The trained master trainers lead the training programme to ensure the effective implementation of HPC Class 1 (Foundational Stage) and Class 3 (Preparatory Stage) across Nagaland in the current academic year. The initiative is part of the state's broader vision, in collaboration with PARAKH, NCERT, to implement HPC across all government schools in a phased manner, extending to the Middle Stage in the subsequent academic year.

The HPC is a key component of the National Education Policy 2020, focusing on competency-based assessment and a more holistic approach to student progress.

WORKSHOP ON "CORS AND GEOID MODEL APPLICATIONS IN LAND SURVEYING HELD

A 2-Day Workshop on "CORS and Geoid Model Applications in Land Surveying" jointly organised by the Urban Development Department & Water Resources Department, Nagaland in collaboration with the Survey of India, Assam & Nagaland and Tripura, Meghalaya, Mizoram Geospatial Directorate, Guwahati was held at the Conference Hall of the Chief Engineer, Water Resources on 12th June, 2025.

CORS (Continuously Operating Reference Stations) and geoid models play crucial roles in modern land high-precision surveying, providing

positioning and elevation data. **CORS** networks offer real-time and post-processed GNSS observations for accurate surveying, while geoid models allow conversion between ellipsoidal and orthometric heights, ensuring accurate land surveying and mapping.

Chief Engineer, Water Resources, Thepfusalie Guozi in his address expressed gratitude to the Survey of India for conducting the training, highlighting the value of learning from qualified trainers and the importance of staying updated with the latest scientific developments in GPS technology. He emphasized the need for better coordination between Water Resources and Urban development to tackle challenges like climate change and other major issues and encouraged inter-department support.

Additional Director, Urban Development, Tarachu Filtu stated that the training would enhance departmental operations and urged the participants to make the most of the opportunity. He stressed that continuous learning and adopting new

technologies are vital for adding value and improving performance.

5-DAY GST TRAINING PROGRAM FOR NAGALAND STATE TAX OFFICERS INAUGURATES IN DIMAPUR

A 5- day "Onsite training on GST for Nagaland State Tax Officers", commenced with its inauguration on 16th June, 2025 at the office of the Commissioner of State Taxes. Dimapur. The program aims to enhance the understanding and implementation of GST laws among the state tax officers, ensuring better service delivery and compliance across the state.

Speaking at the inauguration, Commissioner of Taxes, Abhinav Shivam, IAS emphasized that strengthening tax administration through regular training is crucial for Nagaland's development. He noted that the dynamic nature of GST demands constant learning and adaptation.

Shivam acknowledged the unique challenges, including its geography, infrastructure gaps, and political complexities, which have hindered industrial growth. As Nagaland relies heavily on tax revenues, he said improving tax collection is not just an administrative goal but a developmental necessity.

Despite constraints, the department has made steady progress over the past eight months, focusing on capacity building, officer training, developing in-house compliance tools, and launching joint enforcement operations with CGST. Efforts are also underway to introduce RFID-based tracking systems and an FAQ guide in Nagamese to help new entrepreneurs. He also announced the launch of a Tax Mitra initiative to train local youth as grassroots tax advisors and turn zonal offices into information hubs. The department has recovered over ₹210 crore in

revenue arrears between February and May 2025.

Shivam stressed the need to change public perception of taxation and revealed plans for a public awareness campaign starting in July. He called for tax compliance to become a people's movement, highlighting its role in funding essential services and infrastructure.

child-friendly TLMs and to foster innovation through a competitive exhibition of selfdeveloped TLMs.

Kopele Tepa, founder and proprietor of Bumblebee Inclusive School, led enriching sessions on the development and implementation of Individualized Education Plans (IEPs) and strategies for creating and managing an inclusive classroom environment that addresses the diverse needs of all learners. Rukuse Sakhrie conducted a session on Music Therapy, emphasizing its role in enhancing cognitive, emotional, and social development among children with special needs.

Practical Demonstrations and Hands-on Training were conducted on Speech Therapy, Occupational Therapy, Physiotherapy and Support strategies for children with Visual Impairment. These sessions were facilitated by trained specialists among the IE RPs and Coordinators, allowing participants to gain practical insights and engage in cross disability learning.

At the TLM Exhibition, IE RPs and Coordinators displayed innovative, inclusive, and affordable educational aids developed during their training to support children with disabilities. Commissioner & Secretary, School Education & SCERT, State Mission Director, Samagra Shiksha and Principal Director, Department of School Education also visited the TLM exhibition, appreciated

their efforts, and encouraged them to continue working to ensure no child is left behind.

Winners of the exhibition were recognized for their innovation and practical approach: 1st, 2nd & 3rd positions were bagged by Ngaugongbe of EBRC Athibung, Nungshisenla Ozukum of EBRC Zunheboto and ZumongiKikon of EBRC Peren district respectively.

UNION MINISTER JITENDRA SINGH HOLDS REVIEW MEETING WITH NORTHEAST LEADING SCIENTIFIC INSTITUTIONS IN WOKHA

Development (IBSD), Imphal; CSIR-North East Institute of Science and Technology (NEIST), Jorhat; the office of the Additional Surveyor General, Eastern Zone, Survey of India, Kolkata; and the Directorate of Geo-Spatial Data, Assam and Nagaland, Guwahati.

Each institute delivered a PowerPoint presentation outlining their current outreach technological research, initiatives, collaborative programs. The fellowship is awarded annually to the top 50 rank holders in the HSLC exam conducted by NBSE, based on merit and restricted to Indigenous Scheduled Tribe students of Nagaland. In case of tied ranks, all students with the same marks are included, which may lead to more than 50 awardees. Beneficiaries receive a citation certificate along with the cash award in the first year.

The CMMSF grant will be awarded for five years, with recipients required to maintain a minimum of 80% marks each year to continue receiving the fellowship. Failure to meet this criterion will result in discontinuation. Later, Chief Minister Dr. Neiphiu Rio presented awards and certificates to the toppers.

Ayemi stated that the camp will run from 15th to 30th June 2025, covering 608 villages in Nagaland to uplift tribal communities. He outlined various initiatives undertaken to strengthen surveillance, improve access to treatment, and enhance public awareness, particularly in remote and vulnerable communities. The meeting concluded with a strong reaffirmation of commitment from stakeholders to intensify efforts and work collectively toward making Nagaland TB-free by 2025.

SAMVIDHAN HATYA DIWAS OBSERVED ACROSS NAGALAND

State commemoration of 'Samvidhan Hatya Diwas' was held at the conference hall of Nagaland Civil Secretariat, Kohima on 25 June 2025. This marks the 50 years since the imposition of emergency in India in 1975. The event served as a reminder of the importance of safeguarding democratic values and constitutional rights.

Advisor for Art & Culture and Treasuries & Accounts, K. Konngam Konyak, highlighted the Emergency as a period when democratic processes were disrupted, fundamental rights suspended, and press censored. He emphasized the resilience of Indian democracy and the significance of constitutional governance, especially in regions like Nagaland where stability and liberty must go hand in hand.

Konyak reminded that the Constitution is a living document and has weathered many challenges and emerged stronger each time which is the true testament to the vision of its framers and the vigilance of its citizens, and urged everyone to continue to uphold, protect and cherish our constitutional democracy.

Associate Professor Department of Political Science, Kohima College, Dr. Konei Nakhro in her keynote address on the "The Emergency of 1975: A Constitutional Turning Point" questioned its relevance after 50 years, stating that the answer lies not in nostalgia, but in democratic responsibility.

Highlighting the Northeast's history of constitutional interventions, she emphasized the fragility of democratic governance in politically sensitive regions. Referring to the ongoing ethnic conflict in Manipur, she noted the severe impact on lives and governance, and the concern it drew in Parliament. Dr.

Nakhro stressed that avoiding another Emergency requires collective responsibility from administrators to civil society to uphold the Constitution, protect rights, and preserve democracy. She urged that the memory of 1975 should unite us in defending our freedoms.

Dr. Avile also commented that, due to their efforts, our State's IMR (infant mortality rate) remains one of the lowest in the country which stand at 7 as per SRS 2022 and hope that, we improve on the remaining key indicators in the coming years.

Welcoming the district representatives, Khelito Zhimomi, State Program Dr. Officer, RMNCHA+N appealed to take this opportunity for cross learning between the districts especially on the best practices.

Established by the United Nations General Assembly in 2017, World MSME Day is celebrated annually on June 27 to highlight the significant contributions of MSMEs towards employment generation, innovation, and inclusive economic growth. MSMEs account for over 90% of businesses worldwide, more than 50% of the global

employment and contribute up to 40% of the national income (GDP) in emerging economies.

Nagaland celebrated World MSME Day on 27th June 2025, at the Secretariat Conference Hall, New Secretariat Complex, Kohima organised by Department of Industries and Commerce, Kohima with Advisor for Agriculture, Government of Nagaland, Mhathung Yanthan as the special guest.

Yanthan, in his address, emphasized the vast entrepreneurial potential of MSMEs in agriculture and horticulture sector. He noted improvements in product quality and packaging but stressed the need to scale up. He urged conducting local workshops, translating schemes into local languages, and setting up MSME facilitation centres at KVKs and DICs. Key priorities included mapping district strengths, building clusters, easing finance access, and promoting digital marketing. He also called for integrating with other schemes, partnering with FPOs/ FPCs, and empowering women and youth. He affirmed Nagaland's potential to lead in youth-driven entrepreneurship for a Viksit Bharat.

Ramnikant, IAS, Secretary Kumar for Industries & Commerce, spoke about and Accelerating the Raising MSME Performance (RAMP) programme, World Bank-supported initiative by the Government of India aimed at strengthening the MSME sector. He elaborated on the key focus areas of the RAMP programme in Nagaland, which include capacity building of MSMEs, improving market access by promoting indigenous products under the "Make in Nagaland" initiative, supporting competitiveness and finance green initiatives, enhancing access to finance and markets through expert interactions, and driving institutional development through Management Development **Programs** (MDPs) and targeted training sessions.

The event highlighted several pivotal developments, including the launch of the RAMP Nagaland Portal and the revamped department website, designed to provide MSMEs with enhanced resources and support. Additionally, the iGOT User Manual for Nagaland was unveiled, offering a comprehensive guide for government employees to effectively utilize the Integrated

Government Online Training platform. It is to be noted that the Department of Industries & Commerce is the first government department from Nagaland to onboard 220 officers from the state into the iGOT portal for online training and capacity building.

Furthermore, a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed between the Government of Nagaland and the Quality Council of India (QCI) represented by Manish Vashistha, Deputy Director, QCI, aimed at elevating quality standards and fostering excellence across various sectors. including industry and commerce, within the state. With this MoU, the ZED and LEAN Certification for manufacturing MSMEs from Nagaland is expected to be boosted significantly under the RAMP programme.

The Chairman of the Nagaland Industrial Development Corporation

(NIDC), Kvulo Lorin, in his keynote address underscored the pivotal role of MSMEs in driving global economic growth, creating jobs, and promoting innovation.

Director, Industries & Commerce, P. Tokugha Sema in his concluding remarks, emphasized the importance of collaborative efforts in strengthening the sector and expressed optimism about the positive impact of the RAMP programme and associated initiatives on Nagaland's economic development.

The event, underscoring the state's commitment to empowering MSMEs and positioning them as one of the key players in fostering economic growth, was attended by department officials, Administrative Heads of Departments and MSME representatives from Nagaland.

FOCUS - NAGALAND SIGNS MoA WITH LINE DEPARTMENTS

The handing over of assets under Fostering Climate Resilient Upland Framing System in the Northeast (FOCUS) Nagaland and signing of Memorandum of Agreement (MoA) was held under the Chairmanship of Chief Secretary & Chairman PSC, FOCUS- Nagaland, Dr. J. He also highlighted about the concerns over the maintenance of created assets which the line department may face while continuing the projects.

Earlier, handing over of assets under FOCUS-Nagaland and signing of MoA was done with Department of Fisheries & Aquatic Resources, Department of Animal Husbandry & Veterinary Services, Department of Cooperation and Department of Agriculture.

It may be mentioned that with the signing of the MoA, the line departments accept full responsibility for the assets, including up scaling, maintenance and future utilization of the projects. The said agreements will become effective as on 30 June 2025 upon execution by authorized representatives of both parties.

Manager, Gender & C.I, Hraveine David presented a power point presentation on the expected roles of department post exit of FOCUS- Nagaland project.

MINISTER JACOB ZHIMOMI ATTENDS NATIONAL CONFERENCE AT NEW DELHI

Cooperative Database in streamlining the database and categorizing cooperative societies across various parameters. This, he said, has resulted in aiding the State Government's attempt cancel and weed-out the nonfunctioning cooperatives.

The Minister mentioned that unlike other parts of the country the cooperatives in Northeast are managerially and financially weak and rely on Government support, especially on NCDC funding for taking up various business activities. He called for the India Government of continue funding National Cooperative Development Corporation (NCDC) sponsored projects like Integrated Cooperative Development Project, which he mentioned is very popular among farming community in the Northeast.

Pointing out that one key challenge in computerization of Primary Agricultural Credit Societies (PACS) is the inability of PACS officials and secretaries to effectively understand and adopt the digitization process, Minister Zhimomi suggested for deploying Data Entry Operators at each PACS for a minimum period of three years, which will provide sufficient time for the PACS to build internal capacity and eventually employ operators at their own cost. The Minister further raised some of the issues being faced by PACS in expansion of activities under initiatives such as Jan Aushadhi Kendra, Common Service Centres and Pradhan Mantri Kisan Samridhi Kendra.

Later during the day, Minister Zhimomi also planted some saplings at Nagaland Guest House, R. K. Puram New Delhi as part of 'Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam' campaign. The Minister was accompanied by Cooperation Secretary, Orenthung Lotha, Joint Resident Commissioner, Nagaland House New Delhi, Sharon Longchari, along with officials and staff of Nagaland House, New Delhi.

Zeliang noted that although Nagaland is rich in forests and biodiversity, it is not immune to the growing threat of plastic waste. He pointed out that pollution is visible from urban centers to remote villages, often due to a casual attitude and lack of collective action. "Awareness, action, and accountability are key," he said, urging government officials, community leaders, and citizens alike to actively reduce plastic use.

Highlighting the plantation drive, he said it represents more than symbolism-it's a firm commitment to a greener, healthier Nagaland. Trees, he said, are nature's protectors, helping fight pollution, purify the air, and restore ecosystems. Such initiatives, he added, should educate people on the importance of conservation and afforestation.

Zeliang stressed that the fight against pollution must begin at home and in workplaces, and urged everyone to join forces in combating all forms of pollution that threaten the planet and human wellbeing.

Exhorting the gathering, DC Peren,

Hiazu Meru said, World Environment Day, 2025 calls for collective efforts to tackle plastic pollution and urged all officers posted in the District Head-quarter to carry out their duties sincerely to better serve the people. He also called for united efforts to ensure the success of the mass social work.

The event featured a Green Pledge led by Divisional Forest Officer, Peren, Chisayi, IFS and flagging off of a new JCB, donated by the Nagaland State Disaster Management Authority.

meaningful culmination of In the Village Adoption Committee (VAC) 10-Northern Angami-I Assembly Constituency, the District Planning and Development Board under the Department of Planning and Transformation organized a multi-faceted programme at Rüzhükhrie Government Higher Secondary School. The

event also marked the observance of World Environment Day 2025 and included a session on road safety awareness.

The programme brought together members of the government, community leaders, educational institutions, students, and civil society groups in a collective effort to promote sustainability, safety, and inclusive

development.

Speaking on World Environment Day 2025, Dr. Kekhrielhoulie Yhome, Advisor for School Education and SCERT, urged individuals and communities to take collective action for environmental protection, beginning at home, schools, and localities. He highlighted the day as a reminder of our shared responsibility to safeguard the planet through local initiatives and called for reduced plastic use and lower carbon footprints, especially among students, emphasizing the power of small, daily actions.

Reflecting on the achievements of the VAC, the Advisor described it as meaningful collaboration between communities and over ten government departments, bridging governance with grassroots needs and ensuring better access to government schemes.

To promote sustainable practices, the event saw the distribution of solar street lights and 1,000 avocado saplings to schools and communities. He noted the saplings' role in slope stability, groundwater recharge, and sustainable agriculture.

The programme also featured an awareness session on road safety and vehicular emissions by the RTO and Kohima Traffic Police. Officials highlighted the rise in road accidents in India from 4.37 lakh in 2018 to 5.55 lakh in 2022 and stressed the need for urgent reforms. Key causes such as

human error, poor road design, and delayed emergency response were discussed.

Participants were briefed on the Motor Vehicles Act, including penalties for underage and drunk driving. Students were advised to avoid mobile phones or headphones while walking and use footpaths and zebra crossings. The Good Samaritan law was also promoted to encourage helping accident victims without legal fear.

Chisho K. Swu, AEO (Election), Kohima, presented the initiatives taken by VAC.

In the field of education, he handed over interactive learning kits and a smart TV to Rüzhükhrie Government Higher Secondary School, which serves the highest number of underprivileged students, underscoring the constituency's goal to bridge gaps in digital learning.

She highlighted projects led by the Village Council Development team, including the installation of solar traffic signals and training in traditional crafts. Meanwhile, DC Peren, Hiazu Meru informed that a mass social work at the DC Office Complex will be held on the 4th Friday of every month, encouraging all departments to take part actively.

Principlal, St. Xavier College, Jalukie, Dr. Fr. Francis highlighted the concept behind the proposed Pilot Project for a Private Public Partnership at GHS Nsong and appealed the house to support the project, which the house decided to approve and to forward it to the government.

The proposal to register the Rural Upliftment Society, Tening Town was deferred due to the absence of a verifying officer and society members.

Meanwhile a Labour Department official gave a detailed and satisfactory presentation on department's initiatives.

CONSULTATIVE MEETING ON HUMAN-ELEPHANT CONFLICT MITIGATION HELD IN WOKHA

Consultative meeting on mitigating human-elephant conflict was convened in Wokha on 6th June 2025, bringing together government officials. environmental experts, and community representatives to discuss effective strategies for addressing the escalating conflict between humans and elephants in the region.

Minister of Environment, Forest, and Climate Change, C. L. John speaking as the special guest, highlighted the broader impact of climate change on wildlife behavior and habitat displacement. He noted that the increasing frequency of human-elephant encounters has led to significant losses, including damage to farmlands, destruction of property, and even human casualties. The minister underscored the urgent need to strengthen forest guard training, pointing out that over half of the sanctioned posts remain vacant, leaving critical areas vulnerable. He assured the deployment of additional forest personnel in Bhandari, emphasizing that

while elephant relocation is impractical due to logistical constraints, alternative solutions such as population control measures would be explored.

The meeting was attended by key state leaders, including MLA & Advisor for the Department of Agriculture, Mhathung Yanthan, MLA Y. M. Humtsoe, MLA & Chairman SDPDB Bhandari, Achumbemo Kikon, and Advisor to the Chief Minister, Dr. Chumben Murry.

Addressing the gathering, MLA. Mhathung Yanthan acknowledged the persistent efforts by relevant departments in mitigating human-elephant conflicts. He emphasized the need for swift compensation to affected individuals, reinforcement of community-led conservation initiatives, and the implementation of awareness campaigns, systems, and outreach early warning programs to reduce incidents of elephantrelated damage.

MLA Y. Μ. Humtsoe advocated

for a coexistence-based approach, urging communities to foster a deeper understanding of elephant behavior to minimize confrontations.

Advisor, Dr. Chumben Murry spoke on the expanding human and elephant populations, noting that the increasing proximity of these species has intensified conflicts. He recommended the integration of technology, including artificial intelligence, for better conflict prediction and resolution.

MLA, Achumbemo Kikon stressed the importance of environmental management and habitat preservation, urging authorities to adopt long-term solutions that safeguard both human settlements and elephant populations. He called for immediate, practical interventions that would offer lasting relief to affected communities.

Deputy Commissioner Wokha, Vineet Kumar, reiterated the government's commitment to addressing the crisis, reviewing incident reports, compensation mechanisms, and advocating for technological innovations to tackle elephant-related disasters more efficiently.

Aspecial presentation by Dr. Rudraditya, a wildlife expert, offered scientific insights into elephant instincts and behaviors, including their natural sensory mechanisms and patterns of movement that contribute to conflict situations. He outlined practical mitigation solutions to minimize damages while ensuring safe intervention strategies.

Zuthunglo Patton, IFS, CF (STC) Nagaland, discussed the Forest and Biodiversity Management (KfW) Project, which includes 135 villages across five districts—Kohima, Peren, Wokha, Tuensang, and Mokokchung under a Unified Mitigation Framework Initiative to manage wildlife interactions. Research Associate WII, Rishi Basumatary, provided an overview of conflict-reduction techniques through a detailed presentation.

Representatives from affected villages and communities shared first-hand experiences, describing the real challenges posed by elephant intrusions and urging the government to implement effective longterm solutions.

During the introductory session, Vedpal Singh, IFS, PCCF, and Chief Wildlife Warden, Nagaland, presented data revealing that since 2018, 15 elephants and 5 human lives have been lost due to conflicts. He noted that Nagaland has approximately 440 elephants, with almost half residing in Wokha district. Singh highlighted concerns over the drastic decline in elephant numbers over the past century, while human populations have multiplied sixfold, exacerbating territorial competition. He detailed various mitigation strategies, alongside the challenges faced by conservation departments in effectively implementing them.

The meeting concluded with calls for urgent action, advocating multi-sectoral collaboration, technological interventions, and community-led conservation strategies to ensure a balanced coexistence between human settlements and wildlife.

PUGHOBOTO SDPDB CHARTS GREEN & GROWTH AGENDA IN JUNE MEETING

The June meeting of the Sub-Divisional Planning and Development Board (SDPDB), Pughoboto was held on 6th June 2025 at the New Administrative

Complex, marking a pivotal moment for both sustainable development and infrastructural advancement in the region. The session was chaired by Dr. Sukhato A. Sema, MLA and Chairman of SDPDB Pughoboto, with Tiameren Chang, ADC and Vice Chairman, co-chairing the proceedings.

A key highlight of the meeting was a presentation by Anito Swu, Administrator of New Foundation School and Founder of the "Go Green Club," on the Carbon Credit Program (CCP) under the REDD+ initiative. Implemented by the Mirin Climate Centre in partnership with Infinite Solution, the program aims to help tribal communities in Nagaland conserve forests, reduce deforestation, and earn carbon credits through sustainable practices. The Board praised the initiative as a model for ecoconscious development in the region.

The SDPDB took up several key development agendas and recommended the same including the proposal for establishing of an Industrial Training Institute (ITI) at Pughoboto, Construction of village internal cemented roads at Mishilimi village and Restoration of the Mukalimi-Chishilimi Road, damaged by a landslide near Tsuyi River. LADP Iconic Projects, including a drainage wall, approach roads, and agriculture-based initiatives for both individuals and the community were welcomed by the Board and duly recommended. Construction of New EAC Office and residential quarters at Ghathashi, construction of SDPO Office and quarters along with construction of a Sub-Divisional Customary Court at the New Administrative Complex were also discussed and recommended by the Board.

The proposal for recognition of Kuhozuqa village has been put on hold, in compliance with a standing state government directive to freeze recognition of new villages and subdivision upgrades.

Concluding the session, Dr. Sukhato A. Sema reaffirmed the Board's commitment to sustainable development, infrastructure, and social progress, urging members and the community to remain united in building a resilient and forward-looking Pughoboto.

MANGKOLEMBA SDPDB MEETING HELD

The monthly SDPDB meeting of Mangkolemba was held on 9th June 2025 at the customary court, chaired by Temjen Imna Along, Minister for Tourism and Higher Education, along with Vice Chairman Moakumzuk Tzudir, ADC Mangkolemba.

The Chairman expressed optimism about road projects like Longnak, Tsurangkong & Jangpetkong, and the Foothill Road Initiative, stressing their role in regional development. Acknowledging the subdivision's challenges despite its historic status, he urged officials to be more

Key discussions during the meeting included the recommendation for the

registration of Sozo Mission Society and extension of Tuensang Town at Tuensang Village areas where land survey for the expansion is expected to begin shortly.

Dr. Imlitemsu Ozukum, Chief Medical Officer, Tuensang, highlighted the Nikshay Mitra initiative, which provides nutritional support to TB patients. He appealed to members to contribute financially towards supporting TB patients in the district.

As assigned, the District Fishery Officer, Tuensang, also presented an overview of departmental activities to the Board.

WORLD DAY AGAINST CHILD LABOUR OBSERVED

World Day Against Child Labour was organised by the Labour department in collaboration with District Task Force Kohima at the Central Plaza, Kohima on 12th June 2025. Deputy Commissioner of Kohima, B. Henok Buchem, NCS, graced the event.

In his address, DC stated that the district administration, police, and all enforcement agencies are fully prepared to take action, and urged everyone to remain vigilant. He expressed concern over the rising incidents of atrocities and abuse against women and children, noting that such acts were previously unheard of and not part of Naga society's values. Emphasizing on the moral dimension of child abuse and child labour, he stated, "This is not just a legal issue but one of existence, ethics, and humanity," and called for collective efforts to protect children.

Joint Labour Commissioner Chubayanger emphasized the strict enforcement of the Child and Adolescent

Labour (Prohibition & Regulation) Act, 1986, which protects the rights of children and adolescents across India. The Act bans employment of children under 14 in all occupations, except non-hazardous family work outside school hours. Adolescents (14–18 years) are allowed only in non-hazardous jobs, with hazardous work like stone quarries, brick kilns, and certain industries strictly prohibited.

He cautioned that violations attract stringent penalties, including imprisonment from six months to two years and a fine ranging from ₹20,000 to ₹50,000, or both. Similar penalties apply to those employing adolescents in hazardous occupations. Other violations of the Act can lead to imprisonment up to one month, a fine up to ₹10,000, or both.

Superintendent of Police, Teisovise Metha, NPS, district task force officers, colony chairmen, and others participated in the event. Assistant Labour Commisioner Nimenuo said the welcome address, DCPO Kohima, Sekho Dawhuo highlighted the Child Protection Service.

The Labour Department has urged all establishments, families, and the general public to comply strictly with the provisions of the Act and report any violations to the appropriate authorities.

World Day Against Child Labour was also observed in Dimapur, Tuensang and Wokha districts on June 12, organised by the District Child Protection Unit (DCPU) in collaboration with the Labour Department and District Legal Services Authority, aiming to create awareness on the legal safeguards and responsibilities related to child rights and protection, as initiated by the International Labour Organization (ILO) in 2002.

VIKSIT KRISHI SANKALP ABHIYAN 2025 CONCLUDES AT LONGLENG

CAR-KVK Longleng has successfully concluded the Viksit Krishi Sankalp Abhiyan (VKSA)-2025, a transformative grassroots campaign held from 29th May to 12th June

Three ICAR-KVK Longleng teams led by Shubhendu Kumar Behera (Plant Protection), Dr. Lily Ngullie (Animal Science), and Dr. Kalu Ram (Fruit Science) conducted 109 field visits, covering nine villages daily.

The campaign addressed key agricultural and livestock issues, including soil health, fertilizer use, and pest management. Farmers were also informed about schemes like NMEO and PM-KISAN, and guided on crop challenges like fall armyworm in maize, unfruitfulness in pomegranate, and litchi fruit cracking.

Training under VKSA-2025 in Longleng focused on post-harvest handling and value addition of fruits like litchi and orange to boost farmers' income. Sessions also covered nutrition, hygiene, and baby food to align agriculture with health goals.

In livestock, farmers were trained on piggery management, swine flu, artificial insemination, pregnancy detection, mineral nutrition, insurance, and zoonotic diseases. They also learned about schemes under the National Livestock Mission and Rainbow Rooster poultry.

The campaign also promoted climateresilient practices like drip irrigation, mulching, and rainwater harvesting were promoted, with live demos on strawberry and pomegranate cultivation drawing strong interest.

Alongside the training sessions, the teams recorded farmers' issues, traditional practices, and suggestions were documented to guide future research and outreach.

Dr. Hari Charan Kalita, Senior Scientist and Head of ICAR-KVK Longleng, expressed gratitude to all stakeholders and highlighted the campaign's importance in addressing real-time farming challenges across Longleng's diverse microclimatic zones. He noted that many issues were previously undocumented and that the campaign effectively bridged critical information gaps, especially regarding government schemes and scientific interventions.

Dr. Homeswar Kalita, Head of ICAR-Nagaland Centre, commended the campaign for inspiring researchers to develop locally relevant, practical solutions through stronger farmer-researcher collaboration.

The campaign received strategic support from Dr. S. Hazarika (Director, ICAR-NEH), Dr. A. K. Mohanty (Director, ICAR-ATARI Zone VII), and Dr. A. Mishra (VC, CAU Imphal), ensuring institutional continuity. District leaders W. Manpai Phom and T. Mhabemo Tungoe praised KVK Longleng's outreach and urged farmers to stay engaged with ICAR-KVK future programs

ZUNHEBOTO DPDB MEETING HELD

Zunheboto District Planning and Development Board (DPDB) meeting for the month of June was held on 13th June 2025 at DC's conference hall, Zunheboto under the chairmanship of Deputy Speaker, NLA and DPDB Chairman, S. Toiho Yeptho.

Commissioner Deputy Zunheboto, Dharam Raj (IAS) informed that the hall had received a long-awaited facelift, equipped with modern facilities and thanks the Chairman's initiative and the efforts of DPO (Planning) David Sema.

Zunheboto Govt College gave presentation through Vice Principal Jekugha Sema, outlining the college's history and current challenges. He highlighted the risk of closure of the IGNOU Study Centre due to low enrollment and requested infrastructural support including two smart boards, 10 computer sets, fire extinguishers and a dedicated transformer. With over 200 students currently enrolled and numbers expected to rise, the college also seeks the introduction of B. Ed and science stream courses under the FYUGP curriculum.

In response, the DPDB urged the college to submit proposals to the Power Department for a dedicated transformer and to the Department of Higher Education for introducting a B.Ed. program.

GHSS, Zunheboto Senior Principal, Kughazhe Swu raised concerned over low students in the lone institutions offering Science Stream in the district leading students to migrate elsewhere.

DPDB Chairman, Toiho S. Yeptho echoed the concern, stressing to promote science education locally and proposed involving private school principals in future meetings to address the issue. He emphasized the need for collective efforts to improve local education infrastructure and student confidence, noting the disparity like Mokokchung in terms of higher education institutions.

Both the Chairman and the DC also underscored the importance of attendance warning DPDB meetings, that unexplained absences by Heads of Departments (HODs) would not be accepted.

Dr. Sukhato A. Sema, MLA, emphasized

collective responsibility and shared that his constituency's educational trust offers free admission for classes 8 to 10, boosting enrollment. He urged Zunheboto Government College to explore solar power solutions and submit a proposal for a dedicated transformer.

He also addressed the shortage of substitute teachers, especially during maternity leave, suggesting the trust could help provide temporary teaching support. Dr. Sukhato stressed that quality education, healthcare and economic development are key to the district's progress.

DC Dharam Raj added that science education includes vital subjects mathematics and English, underlining its broader importance.

The DPDB meeting also highlighted the REDD+ Project, a 50-year UN-backed carbon credit initiative promoting forest conservation, clean energy, and economic growth, requiring no personal investment and offering flexible participation. Nagaland now hosts 75 such projects.

Dr. Sukhato emphasized that all 60 constituencies should actively promote forest conservation in their own constituency, suggesting Aghunato as a potential expansion site.

He also proposed that Zunheboto District Hospital to submit a proposal to establish a College of Nursing, ahead of a Union Minister's visit to the district.

In conclusion, the board discussed the 'Viksit Nagaland' agenda following the recent cabinet meeting on 'Viksit Bharat', agreeing that a developed India requires a developed Nagaland. district administration The proposed introducing 'Viksit Zunheboto' in the next DPDB meeting in July, which will include a PowerPoint presentation on the vision

They highlighted his contributions to legal aid, judicial reforms, and improving service conditions, describing him as a wise mentor and a brilliant legal mind whose brief tenure left a lasting impact.

Principal Secretary, Department of Law and Justice, Y. Kikheto Sema, reflected on their shared roots and praised the judge's integrity and public service, wishing him a peaceful retirement with a biblical blessing.

Delivering the farewell reference, Justice Y. Longkumer recounted Justice Sema's academic and professional milestones, from

his Bombay law degree to his judgeship in 2021, highlighting landmark rulings that demonstrated his commitment to justice.

WOKHA DPDB MEETING HELD

The DPDB meeting for Wokha district was held at the Deputy Commissioner's Conference Hall on 21 June 2025 under the chairmanship of DPDB Chairman and Deputy Chief Minister Yanthungo Patton. The meeting was attended by Advisor for Agriculture, Government of Nagaland, Mhathung Yanthan, MLA Mhonbemo Humtsoe, Vice Chairman and Deputy Commissioner, Vineet Kumar IAS and Heads of various Departments.

The House reviewed the proposal to upgrade Cherry Hill Kindergarten School in Wokha and recommended further necessary action as the school met all required criteria.

A presentation by the District AIDS Prevention and Control Unit (DAPCU), led by the District Programme Officer, outlined that it covered district and block-level data on drug users and HIV/AIDS, using maps to show distribution across the district.

DAPCU proposed an Integrated Health Campaign (IHC) across selected colonies and villages to identify individuals with HIV/AIDS, syphilis, tuberculosis, and hepatitis B and C for confirmatory testing and treatment. The campaign will also integrate the CMHIS enrollment, TB & NCD screenings, and community outreach through Anganwadi and ASHA workers. The presentation also highlighted various operational challenges faced by DAPCU in implementing the interventions.

Deputy Commissioner Vineet Kumar, IAS, delivered a comprehensive presentation on Viksit Nagaland for Viksit Bharat@2047, outlining the state's vision and priorities

under national development schemes such as JAM Trinity, Digital India, Make in India, Aatmanirbhar Bharat, GST, Jal Jeevan Mission, Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, Skill India, Startup India, and Stand-Up India.

The DC highlighted Nagaland's strengths, including its natural resources, skilled youth, and strategic location, while also addressing challenges like high government expenditure, limited revenue sources, poor connectivity, and unique land ownership systems.

He noted a positive economic shift toward the tertiary sector and identified key growth drivers: urbanisation, tourism, agriculture, creative industries, technology, mineral-based sectors, and the green economy. He called on all line departments to submit their targets, visions, and achievement plans toward building a shared roadmap for Viksit@Wokha.

Advisor Mhathung Yanthan also urged departments to align their programmes and vision plans to support this development trajectory.

A brief presentation was also delivered by the Senior Scientist and Head of ICAR, highlighting the successful completion of the Viksit Krishi Sankalp Abhiyan across the Wokha district.

In closing, the Deputy Commissioner encouraged all departments and local associations to extend their support to the Wokha football team for the upcoming T. Ao Trophy, scheduled to be held in Kohima in August 2025.

In a significant step towards addressing Wokha substance abuse in district. Deputy Chief Minister, Yanthungo Patton inaugurated the District De-Addiction Centre (DDAC) at Chukitong Town, Wokha, on 21st June 2025. The centre, established through the collaborative efforts of Bethesda Youth Welfare Centre, the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment (Government of India), the Department of Social Welfare (Government of Nagaland), and the Wokha District Administration, aims to provide structured rehabilitation and recovery services to those battling addiction.

The Best KVK Award is a proud recognition of the leadership of Dr. Hari Charan Kalita, Senior Scientist & Head of ICAR-KVK Longleng, and his dedicated team. Their efforts in enhancing farming systems, promoting organic practices, and

training farmers in challenging hilly terrains earned them this honour. The award was presented in the presence of esteemed dignitaries, including Dr. M Ampareen Lyngdoh, Meghalaya's Agriculture Minister; Dr. B.C. Deka, Vice-Chancellor Assam Agricultural University Jorhat; Dr. A.K. The Department of Industries & Commerce and Nagaland Industrial Development Corporation Ltd.. in collaboration with ICAR-National Research Centre on Mithun (NRCM), conducted a twoday technology clinic on "Enhancing Meat Processing Efficiency through Technology" under the RAMP Scheme on 24th & 25th June 2025 at ICAR-NRCM, Medziphema.

Deputy Director of the Department of Industries & Commerce, Keneirienuo T. Zatsu highlighted on the RAMP project's role in empowering MSMEs (Micro, Small, Medium Enterprises). Dr. Girish Patil S, Director of ICAR-NRCM, Medziphema delivered keynote address.

The Clinic covered key areas like Clinic 1 (Dr. Girish Patil S, Director of ICAR-NRCM, Medziphema): Introduction to meat processing, hygiene and value addition benefits; Clinic 2-4 (Dr. Sapunii S. Hanah and assisted by trainer Vivi Kweho): Handson training in meat product formulation (patties, sausages, nuggets), equipment use, preservation techniques and maintaining quality and shelf life.

In addition to the four clinics, the RAMP team from the Directorate of Industries and Commerce conducted an awareness and onspot registration drive for FSSAI and UDYAM. The event saw participation from 27 MSMEs in each session, representing districts

like Kohima, Dimapur, Chumoukedima, Mokokchung, Mon and Wokha.

The clinic concluded with a valedictory Chirantan program graced by Dr. Chattopadhyay, Former V.C, Uttar Banga Krishi Viswavidyalaya, West Bengaland as the Chief Guest and Dr. K.K. Baruah, Member General Body, ICAR, New Delhi as the Guest of Honour, who handed out the certificates and encouraged participants to apply their skills to improve local meat processing standards.

In an effort towards improving public communication, Akashvani Kohima and the District Administration Kohima signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) on 25th June 2025. The collaboration will focus on radio programs and awareness campaigns covering governance, public welfare, health, education, real-time traffic updates, disaster management, and more.

Under the agreement, Akashvani will produce and air programs with input from the District Administration, which will provide officials and experts for participation. The MoU highlights radio's key role in emergency communication, with Akashvani set to broadcast official advisories as per Section 30 of the Disaster Management Act, 2005.

Also, special programs and jingles will also be developed for national/state events and elections. FM Tragopan will provide live traffic updates every 30 minutes from 10 AM-12 PM and 3 PM-5 PM to ease congestion in Kohima city. The initiative is expected to boost the visibility of government schemes and policies, making them more accessible to citizens across Kohima district.

Deputy Commissioner Kohima, Henok Buchem, NCS, shared that the idea of real-time traffic updates via radio was inspired by his college days in Delhi and had been on his mind since taking office. Developed in collaboration with Akashvani Kohima, the initiative went through detailed planning. He emphasized radio's continued impact, especially in rural areas, recalling how he learned of his NPSC result through it. He urged all stakeholders, especially the traffic police, to institutionalize the effort and ensure its success.

The Memorandum of Understanding was signed by Deputy Commissioner Kohima; Additional SP Kohima (Traffic), Z Tshurhosie Kajiri; and Abino Lasuh, Assistant Director (P) and Head of Programme, Akashvani Kohima.

P. PAIWANG KONYAK VISITS HEZUKHU MEMORIAL DISTRICT HOSPITAL ZUNHEBOTO & DISTRICT HOSPITAL, PHEK

Nagaland Health & Family Welfare Minister, Paiwang Konyak, visited Hezukhu Memorial District Hospital, Zunheboto, on 25th June 2025 and held a review meeting with the state health officials and representatives of civil society.

Chairing the meeting, the Minister stated that the purpose of the tour was to

serve public interest and aligns with the Prime Minister's vision of Viksit Bharat by 2047. The visit aimed to assess manpower and ensure proper utilization of funds in the district's health sector.

highlighted various He state government schemes initiated under the Chief Minister's leadership, citing the Chief Minister's Health Insurance Scheme (CMHIS) as a key example. Konyak urged the public and civil societies to stay informed about these schemes and take full advantage of their benefits.

He also reviewed ongoing health projects in the district, including staff quarters, the IPHL Lab, and announced future plans such as the construction of an urban PHC, a CMO Office, a 30-bedded AYUSH hospital, a CHC at Pughoboto, PHC at Satoi, Hoshephu MO quarters, and a nursing school. The Minister called for the collective support of the public and civil society groups to ensure the successful completion of these initiatives.

Advisor for Food & Civil Supplies, K.T. Sukhalu (IAS Rtd.), assured assistance for the expansion of the hospital's equipment room expansion under the Corporate Social Responsibility Scheme.

On 26th June 2015, the Minister visited District Hospital, Phek, where he inspected the medical warehouse, discussed transportation and stock issues with Medical Superintendent and Subordinate Doctors.

The Minister also interacted civil societies, church leaders, town councilors and public leaders at the Conference Hall, District Hospital Phek. As part of the "Viksik Nagaland for Viksit Bharat" initiative, he encouraged improved healthcare services and suggested OPD timings be maintained from 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM.

The Minister was accompanied by Deputy Commissioner, Phek, Rhosietho Nguori; SP Phek, Dr. Pritpal Kaur, IPS and district officers of various departments during the inspection of the DH Phek.

INTERNATIONAL DAY AGAINST DRUG ABUSE & ELLICIT TRAFFICKING HELD ACROSS THE STATE

KOHIMA

The Kohima District Nasha Mukt Bharat Abhiyaan Committee observed the International Day Against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking with the theme "Breaking the Chain: Prevention, Treatment, Recovery for All" on June 26, 2025 at the NHAK Auditorium, Kohima organized by the District Administration Kohima in collaboration with Project REST, NHAK Kohima.

Deputy Commissioner Henok Buchem, NCS, called for a balanced approach to drug abuse, combining strict enforcement with rehabilitation. Highlighting that over 90% of users are youth, he referenced global models for both rehab and punitive measures. He urged stakeholders, law enforcement, healthcare, NGOs, educators, and families, to work together in a culturally relevant, compassionate response. **Encouraging** youth, he affirmed, "It's never too late to rebuild your life."

Additional SP (Protocol & Traffic), Z. Tshurhosie Kajiri, in his talk on "Police and Community Partnership in Drug Prevention and Harm Reduction Services," emphasized that law enforcement's role is to protect lives, not just make arrests. From 2022 to June 2025, 81 drug-related cases were registered in Kohima district, with 116 arrests (98 males and 18 females), mostly under Sections 21(c) and 22(c) of the NDPS Act. He noted that these figures likely underrepresent the actual extent of drug abuse. Kajiri stressed the importance of police-community collaboration, urging efforts to build trust, improve treatment access, reduce stigma, and treat addiction as a disease, not a crime.

During a legal awareness session, Kezhosano Kikhi, Deputy Legal Aid Defence Counsel, DLSA Kohima, gave an overview of the NDPS and NLTP Acts. She stressed the legal distinction between users and suppliers, noting that Section 64A of the NDPS Act provides immunity for users seeking rehabilitation. She also called for clearer guidelines and consistent enforcement of the NLTP Act, especially regarding local brew.

Ark Foundation President Ketholelie Angami warned of a "second wave" of addiction in Nagaland, driven by cheaper, more accessible drugs like Sunflower, affecting even children as young as 12. He noted the rise in female users and urged for more de-addiction centres, including facilities for women, early prevention in schools, and stigma-reducing community outreach.

Dr. Sungtimen Jamir, Nodal Officer of Project REST, NHAK, introduced the outpatient-based psychosocial intervention program launched in August 2023. It recovering supports individuals substance dependence through free services like therapy, counselling, life skills training, and family support, led by a multidisciplinary team. He emphasized the program's focus on reducing stigma and building a supportive recovery community. The launch of an Alcoholics Anonymous group in February 2025 has created a space for shared healing, with plans for a Narcotics Anonymous group underway. He expressed hope for continued growth with support from government, civil society, and health professionals.

International Day Against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking was also observed in the districts of Mokokchung, Tuensang, Mon, Niuland, Tseminyu, Shamator and Meluri.

The observance brought together District

Administration, stakeholders from medical institutions, law enforcement, NGOs, legal bodies, and the wider community, reflecting a shared commitment to address addiction through prevention, treatment, and recovery.

WANGPANG KONYAK DISTRIBUTES SMARTPHONES TO ANGANWADI WORKERS OF PEREN DISTRICT

Advisor for Social Welfare, Government of Nagaland, Wangpang Konyak has formally handed over Smartphone to 20 (twenty) Anganwadi Workers of the Jalukie ICDS Project under the Saksham Anganwadi & Poshan 2.0 Scheme during a programme held at St. Xavier's Parish, Jubilee Hall, Jalukie Town on 27th June, 2025.

In his speech, Wangpang Konyak stated that beyond distributing smartphones, his main purpose was to assess the challenges faced by the Social Welfare Department, especially Anganwadi Workers. He reminded staff to stay at their postings and serve sincerely, emphasizing their crucial role in bringing positive change. He urged close coordination with the district administration for smooth implementation of welfare schemes and encouraged raising awareness at the village level to ensure benefits reach the grassroots.

Addressing the issue of bogus entries in old age pension schemes, he directed officials and Anganwadi Workers to verify and remove wrongful beneficiaries and submit monthly reports to the department.

Short speeches were also delivered by the Secretary of Social Welfare, Yongchingkumla and Deputy Commissioner of Peren, Hiazu Meru. The Advisor was accompanied by the Secretary of Social Welfare, Joint Secretary and other officials from the Directorate.

The Advisor also held an interactive session with officials and staff of the Social Welfare Department, Peren, noting their concerns and assuring them that the issues raised would be duly addressed.

It may be noted that Chief Minister, Dr. Neiphiu Rio had earlier laid the foundation stones of the following seven LSCs on 1st December 2024: Government High School Angjangyang, Mon; Government Higher Secondary School, Kigwema, Kohima; Government Higher Secondary School, Niuland; Government Higher Secondary School. Peren: Government Higher Secondary School, Tseminyu; Government Higher Secondary School, Tuensang: Government Higher Secondary School, Wokha.

Lighthouse School Complexes (LSCs) are envisioned as model schools with all necessary facilities required to function as hubs of academic excellence that support neighbouring spoke schools. Under the NECTAR project, one (1) Lighthouse School Complex (LSC) each will be developed in sixteen (16) districts of Nagaland. LSCs will be spaces of holistic learning fostering inclusivity, strong community engagement and constant innovation thriving on local knowledge of the communities. Lighthouse School Complexes will be economically and

ecologically sustainable and also promote an evidence-based education system. They will lay emphasis on reaching out to the Socio-Economically Disadvantaged Groups (SEDGs) and provide learning spaces with adequate resources for Children with Special Needs (CWSN). Further, LSCs will work towards integrating the National Education Policy's (NEP) recommendations on school management and teaching-learning practices.

Currently, the foundational works for all sixteen Lighthouse School Complexes are being laid and the NECTAR Engineering Team is closely monitoring the progress. The construction works are by being carried out with strict adherence to the World Bank's Environmental and Social Standards to avoid potential adverse project impacts while promoting sustainable development. The total cost for the construction of the 16 LSCs has been estimated at 198.57 crores.

In his speech, KG Kenye emphasized the vital role of power in daily life, adding that it sustains us and drives development. He emphasized that from charging mobile phones to lighting bulbs and enabling space missions, energy is essential in the modern world.

Highlighting the State's rich natural resources, Kenye emphasized the need to explore and utilize them. He stated that all forms of clean energy including small hydro, solar and bio will be pursued for energy generation, and the power sector will be open to international investment.

The 1 MW Ponglefo Small Hydro Electric Project (SHP), located at Salomi Village in Kiphire District, Nagaland, is a run-of-theriver project developed by the Department of Power, Nagaland. Harnessing the Likimo River, a tributary of the Tizu River, the plant is designed to generate around 3.9 million units of electricity annually. Funded by the Ministry of New and Renewable Energy (MNRE), the North Eastern Council (NEC), and the State Government, the project features two 500 KW horizontal Francis turbines. Connected to the state grid, it enhances power supply in the region and supports Nagaland's goal of promoting clean energy and sustainable rural development

Minister Power & Parliamentary Affairs, KG Kenye virtually unveiled the plaque and switched on the power machine of the 1 MW Ponglefo Small Hydro Electric Project.

Chief Engineer of the Power Department, Er Kasho Chishi also presented a technical report of the project during the program.

The physically inauguration of the 1 MW Ponglifo Small Hydro Project at Salomi village under Kiphire district was done by Advisor Fire and Emergency Services Home Guard Civil Defence Relief and Rehabilitation, S Kiusumew Yimchunger on 5th June 2025. He stated that Chief Minister, Dr. Neiphiu Rio and Power Minister, GK Kenya has played a pivotal role in making the dream come true and acknowledged them for their unwavering commitment in creating revenue generating projects across the state

A seven-storey facility to serve as a hub for Naga handloom, handicrafts, and cultural promotion of the Nagaland State Emporium Complex, a landmark initiative to promote and preserve the rich handloom and handicrafts tradition of the state, was formally inaugurated by the Chief Minister of Nagaland, Dr. Neiphiu Rio, in Kohima on 6th June 2025. The inaugural ceremony was held in the presence of Prasielie Pienyu, Chairman of the Nagaland Handloom & Handicrafts Development Corporation Ltd. (NHHDC), and other dignitaries.

Addressing the gathering, Chief Minister Dr. Neiphiu Rio praised everyone involved in the project, highlighting its cultural and economic value, calling it a "beacon of identity and opportunity." He emphasized the need to preserve and promote the rich heritage of Nagaland's diverse tribes with authenticity and pride. He stressed the need for proper documentation and quality control, urging the preservation of traditional songs, artefacts, textiles, and cuisines. "Authenticity must be preserved, with tribal authorities' approval for designs before production to protect our cultural integrity," he said.

Dr. Rio also advocated collaboration between professional designers and local artisans, promotion of Naga cuisine, and structured systems for value addition. "Let us not merely export raw materials, but create finished products that showcase the richness of our traditions," he said while calling on private and government partners to invest in skills, institutions, and marketing efforts that elevate Nagaland's craftsmanship to global standards.

Speaking at the inauguration, Prasielie Pienyü said the new complex marks the fulfillment of a long-cherished vision and symbolizes Nagaland's cultural pride, artisan resilience, and the economic potential of its handloom and handicrafts sector. He shared that the seven-storey facility houses a state emporium, shopping areas, a restaurant, library, conference hall, and guest accommodations for visiting artisans and officials. Pienyü also noted that emporiums earlier set up in Delhi, Kolkata, and five districts of Nagaland have played a key role in promoting local crafts and sustaining traditional livelihoods.

One of the key highlights of the day was

the formal launch of the Naga Unity Shawl, an initiative aimed at visually representing the collective identity of the Naga people across tribal lines. While every tribe in Nagaland has its distinct traditional shawl, the idea of a common shawl representing Naga unity had long been envisioned. The Unity Shawl has now been conceptualized and woven at the Weaving Production Centre of NHHDC Ltd., Dimapur.

Men's Shawl: Designed in three panels, the top and bottom panels feature the commonly used Naga colors—black, red, and white. The center panel is white, bordered with black and adorned with painted or embroidered motifs that symbolize elements common to all Naga tribes.

Women's Shawl: A single-panel design divided into three sections. The top and bottom feature multicoloured stripes reflecting the color palette seen across Naga women's attire. The central white section includes motifs inspired by traditional ornaments and crafts, signifying the artistry and strength of Naga women.

The shawls were unveiled as a step towards building a shared visual symbol of unity among the diverse tribal communities of the state.
